A PROCLAMATION

APPOINTING MONDAY, THE FIRST DAY OF JANUARY, ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FORTY, A BANK HOLIDAY THROUGHOUT ENGLAND, WALES AND NORTHERN IRELAND FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE BANK HOLIDAYS ACT, 1871.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS We consider it desirable, in the circumstances of the present emergency, that Monday, the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty, should be kept as a close holiday in all banks in England, Wales and Northern Ireland, and, should, as regards bills of exchange and promissory notes payable in England, Wales or Northern Ireland, be deemed to be a Bank Holiday for all the purposes of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section four of the said Act, We do by this Our Royal Proclamation, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, appoint the said first day of January to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout England, Wales and Northern Ireland:

And We do declare that this Proclamation does not have the effect of making the said day a holiday under, or for the purposes of, the Holidays Extension Act, 1875.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twentieth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and in the Fourth year of Our Reign.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 13th day of December, 1939 (N.12346/39), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council dated the 6th of May, 1938, there was established a branch of Your Majesty's Navy entitled the Air Mechanic Branch, the lowest ratings in which were Air Mechanic Probationer and Air Mechanic:

“And whereas, for the better administration of the Air Mechanic Branch we are of opinion that the two lowest ratings should be entitled Air Mechanic 2nd Class and Air Mechanic 1st Class:

“We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty, by Your Order in Council, may be graciously pleased to sanction this proposal with effect from such date as we may determine.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

HIS MAJESTY, in pursuance of section one of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1939 (2 & 3 Geo. 6. c. 62), and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that after Regulation fifty-six of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, the following Regulation shall be inserted:—

“ Power of Postmaster-General to refuse transmission of certain circulars.

56A.—(1) With a view to preventing the obstruction of essential postal services by the transmission of circulars issued for the purpose of enabling persons to participate in competitions, the Postmaster-General may refuse to transmit any postal packet as to which he is satisfied that it contains such a circular, and any such packet found in the post may be detained.

(2) Where any postal packet is detained under the power conferred by this Regulation the Postmaster-General shall send by post notice to the sender of the packet informing him at what post office the packet is detained, and that it will be destroyed unless within such time as may be specified in the notice, not being less than two days after the service of the notice, the packet is removed by the sender from that post office; and if the packet is not so removed it may be destroyed.

(3) Nothing in this Regulation shall authorise the Postmaster-General to refuse to transmit any newspaper registered under the Post Office Act, 1908, or the detention of any such newspaper.”

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of November, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Bradfield, Saint Clare and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Cockfield, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Bradfield, Saint Clare and Cockfield duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich embodies certain modifications thereof:

“ And whereas the said Benefices of Bradfield, Saint Clare and Cockfield are now full being held in plurality by the Reverend Cornwell Robertson under the authority of a Dispensation:

“ And whereas the Patrons of the said Benefice of Bradfield, Saint Clare are willing to surrender their patronage in favour of the Patrons of the said Benefice of Cockfield as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Bradfield, Saint Clare and the said Benefice of Cockfield shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Cockfield with Bradfield, Saint Clare ’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Lavenham but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Cockfield shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate or occasional clerical or lay assistance and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice, namely, £150 per annum of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefice of Bradfield, Saint Clare pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or for occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid, which fund shall be paid by Queen Anne's Bounty to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of a Curate or the expenses of occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid.

" 5. That with the consents of Louisa Eliza Crossfield, Spinster, Miranda Fanny Crossfield, Spinster, and Adeline Mary Crossfield, Spinster, all of Number 5, Boyne Park, Tunbridge Wells, in the County of Kent, being the Patrons of the said Benefice of Bradfield, Saint Clare (in testimony of which consents they have signed this Scheme), upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the patronage of the said Benefice of Bradfield, Saint Clare shall be surrendered to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Cockfield and upon the union taking effect the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Cockfield.

" 6. That, upon the union taking effect, of the fund in the hands of Queen Anne's Bounty being or representing the net proceeds of the sale of the Parsonage House now or lately belonging to the said Benefice of Bradfield, Saint Clare the sum of £300 shall be transferred to and shall form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and shall be constituted a fund for the repair of the fabric of the Church at Bradfield, Saint Clare and the balance of the said fund in the hands of Queen Anne's Bounty together with any accumulations thereof shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Bradfield, Saint Clare and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty for the augmentation of the Benefice of Higham, Saint Mary, in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the

provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 39 of the Midland (Amalgamated) District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments and prescribe the 18th day of December, 1939, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

The Midland (Amalgamated) District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended as follows:—

1. Clause 23 of the Scheme shall have effect as if:—

(i) sub-clause (2) thereof were re-numbered "(2) (a)", and at the end of sub-clause (2) thereof the following new paragraphs were inserted:—

"(b) The Independent Chairman may preside at Meetings of any sub-committee appointed by the District Co-ordinating Committee in accordance with sub-clause (9) (b) hereof and shall preside thereat if so directed by the Executive Board.

(c) The Independent Chairman may from time to time by writing under his hand appoint such independent person as he may think fit (including an Officer of the Scheme) to act as his Deputy for a specified occasion or occasions. In respect of the occasion or occasions for which he is appointed to act any such Deputy shall have all the powers (hereinafter prescribed) of the Independent Chairman and accordingly references in the Scheme to the Independent Chairman shall be deemed to include references to his duly appointed Deputy."

(ii) at the end of sub-clause (3) thereof the following words were inserted:—

"A Quorum at a Meeting of any sub-committee of the District Co-ordinating Committee appointed in accordance with sub-clause (9) (b) hereof and upon which every Selling Agent is, by virtue of the Resolution appointing such sub-committee, entitled to be represented, shall be five Members of the sub-committee, unless the Resolution appointing such sub-committee shall otherwise specify."

(iii) for sub-clause (4) thereof there were substituted the following sub-clause, that is to say:—

"4 (a) Voting at Meetings of the District Co-ordinating Committee shall be by show of hands, but at any Meeting the Independent Chairman shall decide, in such manner as appears to him fair and equitable, all matters (other than questions of policy referred to the Executive Board under paragraph (c) of sub-clause (9) of this Clause) unless the members of the Committee present at the Meeting shall by voting arrive at a unanimous decision thereon.

(b) Where the Independent Chairman presides at a Meeting of any sub-committee of the District Co-ordinating Committee appointed in accordance with sub-clause (9) (b) hereof and upon which every Selling Agent is, by virtue of the resolution appointing such sub-committee, entitled to be represented he shall have the like powers of decision as those conferred upon him by the preceding paragraph of this sub-clause. The decision of a sub-committee at a Meeting at which the Independent Chairman presides shall not, unless the Independent Chairman otherwise directs, be subject to approval and confirmation by the District Co-ordinating Committee in accordance with paragraph (b) of sub-clause (9) of this clause.

(c) Any decision of the Independent Chairman, given in pursuance of the foregoing provisions of this sub-clause, and any decision of a sub-committee of the District Co-ordinating Committee which the Independent Chairman does not direct shall receive approval and confirmation by the District Co-ordinating Committee, shall be deemed to be, for all the purposes of the Scheme, a decision of the District Co-ordinating Committee."

2. There shall be inserted immediately after Clause 23 of the Scheme the following new Clause that is to say:—

"23 (A) (1) In this Clause the expression "Export Coal" means external coal available for shipment as foreign cargo, foreign bunkers, trawler bunkers and coast-wise bunkers.

(2) (a) The Executive Board shall appoint a Committee (to be known as "the Export Sales Committee") consisting of such number of persons (whether members of the Executive Board or not) as the Board may think fit, whose functions, subject to the directions of the Executive Board, shall be to control direct and co-ordinate the sales of Export Coal made by Selling Agents on behalf of the Coalowners of the respective groups.

(b) Voting at Meetings of the Export Sales Committee shall be by show of hands and a quorum shall be a majority of the members of the Committee.

(c) The Executive Board shall appoint an Independent Chairman to preside at all meetings of the Committee, or any sub-committee thereof, and such Independent Chairman shall have the like powers of appointing a Deputy to preside at meetings of the

Committee or any sub-committee thereof and of decision at such meetings as are herein before prescribed for the Independent Chairman of the District Co-ordinating Committee and accordingly references in this Clause to the Independent Chairman of the Export Sales Committee shall be deemed to include references to his duly appointed Deputy.

(3) With the object of obtaining the highest price reasonably practicable for every class or grade of Export Coal offered for sale or sold by Selling Agents, the Export Sales Committee shall issue directions to such Selling Agents as to the price or prices below which every class or grade of Export Coal of the Coalowners of the groups shall not be offered for sale or sold, as to the terms and conditions upon which such offers or sales shall be made, and as to the period of any contracts made for the sale or supply of such coal.

(4) Without prejudice to the generality of their functions, the Export Sales Committee shall:—

(a) Take such steps as will ensure that the Export Coal of the Coalowners of the Groups is not in competition and is sold to the best advantage;

(b) If so authorised by the Executive Board, obtain from the Coalowners of each Group returns of all sales of Export Coal made by the Selling Agent of the Group, including such relevant particulars as may be necessary to enable the Committee properly to perform their functions; and

(c) Keep records of all such Sales available for inspection by or on behalf of any Selling Agent.

(5) (a) The Export Sales Committee shall appoint two sub-committees (consisting of such persons, whether members of the Export Sales Committee or not, as the Committee may think fit, so however that every Selling Agent interested in the sale or supply of Export Coal shall be entitled to one representative thereon) to deal with specific matters (not being questions of policy) relating to the shipment of Export Coal through East and West Coast Ports respectively, such sub-committees to be known as the "East Coast Sub-committee" and the "West Coast Sub-committee" respectively.

(b) The Resolutions appointing such sub-committees shall define their functions and determine their procedure and the decisions of such sub-committees shall be subject to approval and confirmation by the Export Sales Committee; Provided that a decision of either of such sub-committees shall, unless the Independent Chairman otherwise directs, be deemed to be for all the purposes of the Scheme a decision of the Export Sales Committee.

(6) No Selling Agent shall enter into any supply contract for the sale or supply of Export Coal otherwise than in accordance with the directions of the Export Sales Committee, and each Selling Agent shall comply with all directions issued by the Export Sales Committee.

(7) Any Coalowner who is aggrieved by any act or omission of any other Coalowner

in his group, or of his Selling Agent, or any Selling Agent who is aggrieved by any act or omission of another Selling Agent, concerning the sale or supply of Export Coal, shall have the right to refer the matter for decision by the Export Sales Committee.

(8) Any Coalowner or Selling Agent who is aggrieved by any act or omission of the Export Sales Committee or the Executive Board concerning the sale or supply of Export Coal shall have the right to refer the matter for decision by the Sales Arbitrator and the provisions of sub-clauses (8) and (9) of Clause 23 hereof shall apply to such reference.

(9) The provisions of Clauses 20, 22, 23, 28 and 33 of the Scheme shall, so far as regards the sale or supply of Export Coal be read construed and have effect subject to the provisions of this Clause."
