And whereas by his consent dated 11th July, 1939, the Minister allowed an extension of time for the exercise of the powers until the 12th January, 1940.

And whereas the Corporation have made application to the Minister for a further extension of time for the exercise of the powers conferred by the Order.

Now, therefore, the Minister hereby allows an extension of time for the exercise of such powers until the 12th January, 1941.

LOWESTOFT BOROUGH COUNCIL.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 28th December, 1939, the Minister of Transport—

(a) made the Borough of Lowestoft (Traffic Regulation) Order, 1939, under Section 46 (2) of the Road Traffic Act, 1930 and Section 3 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1936, and

(b) confirmed the Town Council of the Borough of Lowestoft Traffic Regulation Order, 1938, made by the Borough Council of Lowestoft under Section 46 (2) of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended by Section 29 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933.

The Borough of Lowestoft (Traffic Regulation) Order, 1939, provides that no person shall drive any vehicle on that part of the London—

Great Yarmouth Trunk Road (A 12) (known as London Road South, Lowestoft) which lies between Parade Road North and a point 23 yards south of the swing bridge otherwise than from south-west to north-west.

The Town Council of the Borough of Lowestoft Traffic Regulation Order, 1938, provides that no person shall drive any vehicle on any length of road specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto otherwise than in the direction specified opposite to such length in the second column of the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

Parade Road North	From South East to North West.
Royal Thoroughfare	From North West to South East.
The Road leading from London Road South to Royal Terrace	From North to South.

The Road on the North East side of the Harbour Hotel for a distance of fifteen feet in a south easterly direction from its junction with London Road South	From North West to South East.
