The Conferences touching the Pretensions of the Dutchess of Orleans on the Palatinate, have been discontinued for some time; and its believ'd, they will not be renewed before Easter; when the Abbot Theſi, one of the French Commissioners, who is gone to Paris to receive New Instructions, is expected back.

Hamburgh, March 13. On the 24th past, here were publick Rejoicings, with a very fine Fire-work by order of our Magistrates, for the Marriage of the King of the Romans. Our Letters from Copenhagen say, the Sieur de Chamilly, Ambassador from the Most Christian King, made his Publick Entry there the 28th past. Letters from Moscow of the 24th of January give an Account, that Monsieur Printz, Envoy from the Elector of Brandenburg arrived there that day; the Czar was then at a Country-house near Moscow, but would return to Moscow and give him Audience the 31st. The same Letters say, a great number of Persons had been Executed by the Czar's Order, for having been concerned in a Conspiracy against him; and that the Princess Sophia, his Sister, is put into a Nunnery. They had received Advice at Moscow, that a great Rebellion was broke out in Persia, at the Head of which was one, who pretended to be descended from the true Family of the Sophy's of that Country, and had already got together near Tauris about 100000 Men.

Brussels, March 15. The Elector of Bavaria continues at Marimont, where he gave Audience on Friday last to the Marquis de Pomponne, who is sent by the Most Christian King as his Envoy Extraordinary, to make the Compliment of Condolence at this Court on the Death of the Electoral Prince of Bavaria; and he has since had Audience of the Electores. The Regulations concerning the Forces to be kept on foot in the Spanish Netherlands, will now in a short time be put in Execution. Directions are given for making a Canal from Bruges to the Scheld.

Hague, March 17. The Heer Cleverkirke, Ambassador from the States-General to His Majesty of Great-Britain, is gone for England, in order to take his Audiences of Leave, and after that to return hither; And in the mean time, the Heer Geldermalsen, who is to succeed him, prepares for his departure. The Heer Opdam, whom the States have appointed to be their Envoy to the Elector of Brandenburg, and their Plenipotentiary at the Conferences for adjusting the Affair of Elbing, will go from hence in few days to Berlin. The States having lately granted Pensions to divers French Officers who have served in Savoy and Piedmont, and who are banished from thence on account of their Religion, appeared yesterday before the Council of State, to take an Oath of Fidelity to this State.

Plymouth, March 7. The Harrison of London, Richard Merry's Master, came into this Port yesterday from Lisbon; The Sedgwick of London, James Smith's Master, likewise came in here from Jamaica: And the Fortune of Stockholm, with Deals from Stockholm; The May Fortune of London, Thomas Barnes's Master, for Barbadoes; And the St. Francis of St. Sebastian, Anthony L'frados, Master, bound home from London.

Cowes, March 8. Yesterday came in here the O-Porto Merchant, George Fairfax's Master, with Wine and Fruit from O-Porto, bound to London; the Richard and John of Weymouth, Tho. Friend's Master, and the Happy Return of London, Tho. Parsons's Master, both bound to Fiall; The Mary Galley of London, Robert Hirschcock's Master,

bound to Newfoundland, and the Coronation of London to O-Porto.
