## FOOD AND DRUGS ACT, 1938.

NOTICE is hereby given that by the Scarborough (Food) Order, 1940, dated the 8th day of January, 1940, the Minister of Health has declared that on and after the 1st day of February, 1940:—

(a) the provisions of section 14 of the Food and Drugs Act, 1938, shall be in force in the borough of Scarborough; and

(b) the provisions of section 36 (Registration of premises used for preparation of potted or preserved foods) of the Scarborough Corporation Act, 1925, as amended by section 4 (Registration of premises for preparation or manufacture of ice-cream for sale) of the Scarborough Order, 1930, confirmed by the Ministry of Health Provisional Orders Confirmation (Barry and Scarborough) Act, 1930, shall be repealed.

A copy of the above-mentioned Order may be inspected at the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Scarborough, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any weekday except Saturday, and between 10 a.m. and 12 noon on a Saturday.

## FOOD AND DRUGS ACT, 1938.

NOTICE is hereby given that by the Hoylake (Food) Order, 1940, dated the 8th day of January, 1940, the Minister of Health has declared that on and after the 1st day of February, 1940,—

(a) the provisions of section 14 of the Food and Drugs Act, 1938, shall be in force in the urban district of Hoylake; and

(b) the provisions of section 60 (Registration of ice-cream manufacturers and premises) and section 61 (Power to refuse registration of or remove from register ice-cream manufacturers and premises) of the Hoylake Urban District Council Act, 1935, shall be repealed.
