"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, with effect from the 16th November, 1939, the grant of these Special Allowances up to a maximum of $\pounds 2$ a week in excess of any Marriage Allowance or Dependents' Allowance that may be payable in respect of the man.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 29th day of February, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134; of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49; and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church known as Christ Church situate in the Parish of Clevedon in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church situate as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis, Bishop of Bath and Wells (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Clevedon which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church known as Christ Church situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Clevedon.

"And with the like consent of the said Francis, Bishop of Bath and Wells (testified as

aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church. known as Christ Church, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend James Ernest Pugh, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage as of the said Parish of Clevedon, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church known as Christ Church, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said James Ernest Pugh.

THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Clevedon, being:-

" All that part of the Parish of Clevedon, in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells, which is bounded upon part of the south and upon part of the east by the New Parish of All Saints, East Clevedon, upon the remaining part of the east and upon part of the north by the Parish of Walton in Gordano, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north, upon the north-west, upon the south-west and upon the remaining part of the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point near Old-park House where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Walton in Gordano from the said Parish of Clevedon reaches the northern side of Robin Lane, and extending thence first south-westward to and then generally westward and along the middle of Robin Lane for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading into Park Road, and extending thence southwestward to, and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 13¹/₂ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Park Road, and extending thence first south-westward across Park Road to, and then first south-westward and then in various directions along the middle of the footpath which leads into Hill Road for a distance of $II\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the north-eastern side of Hill Road near its junction with Bellevue Road, and extending thence south-westward across Hill Road to and along the middle of Bellevue Road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Linden Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Linden Road for a distance of 13¹/₄ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Prince's Road and Lower Linden Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Lower Linden Road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chapel Hill and Highdale Avenue, and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Highdale Avenue for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the boundary
