Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of March, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of a part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said United Benefice') of Cockley Cley with Gooderstone in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas under the terms of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 6th day of February, 1925, and published in the London Gazette on the 10th day of the same month for effecting the union of the Benefice of Cockley Cley and the Benefice of Gooderstone a part or share of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Cockley Cley with Gooderstone (that is to say the first and third turns in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the

said United Benefice after the union) was assigned to the Patron of Cockley Cley:

"And whereas the union of the said Benefices of Cockley Cley and Gooderstone took effect on the 6th day of October, 1938:

"And whereas the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Cockley Cley with Gooderstone is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Sir Samuel Roberts, Baronet, of Cockley Cley Hall in the said County of Norfolk:

"And whereas the said Samuel Roberts is desirous that the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Cockley Cley with Gooderstone now vested in him, as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Norwich for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Bertram, now Bishop of Norwich, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of Patronage which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Cockley Cley and Gooderstone:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Samuel Roberts (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Cockley Cley with Gooderstone now vested in him, the said Samuel Roberts as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."
