CHRISTCHURCH CORPORATION.

(Petition for Additional Provision.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application has been made to Parliament by a Petition for Additional Provision for leave to introduce into the Bill now pending in Parliament promoted by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Christchurch (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") the title of which is "A Bill to make further and better provision for the improvement health local government and finances of the borough of Christchurch; and for other purposes", provisions as to

(a) the control of motorboats, particularly as regards speed limits and the fitting of silencers and for regulating the keeping or landing of boats and the separation of particular classes of boats on so much of the River Avon as lies between Quartley's Bridge or Town Bridge and its junction with the River Stour at Clay Pool in the Borough of Christchurch;

(b) the control jointly by the Corporation and the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Bournemouth (hereinafter referred to as "the Bournemouth Corporation") of motorboats, particularly as regards speed limits and the fitting of silencers and for regulating the keeping or landing of boats and the separation of particular classes of boats on the River Stour from Iford Oat or Iford Dowells southward to Clay Pool where the said river unites with the River Avon and thence the united waters to the Haven mouth including Christchurch Harbour such river and harbour being partly in the Borough of Christchurch and partly in the County Borough of Bournemouth.

(c) the administration and enforcement of the provisions referred to in paragraph (b) of this Notice by a Joint Committee appointed by the Corporation and the Bournemouth Corporation.
