

INCOME TAX.

THE DUDLEY BRIERLEY HILL & DISTRICT GAS COMPANY.

GAS UNDERTAKINGS ACT, 1929.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Dudley Brierley Hill & District Gas Company whose Head Office is situate at Spring Gardens Dudley in the County of Worcester intend to apply to the Board of Trade under Section 1 of the Gas Undertakings Act, 1929, for an Order authorising the Company (a) to raise at any time during the period of three years after the date on which the Order comes into operation additional share capital to the amount of £37,500, and (b) to borrow on mortgage of the undertaking or by the creation and issue of debenture stock an amount not exceeding 75 per centum of the additional share capital so authorised and paid up and of any premiums paid in respect thereof.

Modifications of the enactments which apply to the Company and their undertaking are necessary in the following respects to give effect to the proposed Order:—

Section 31 (Additional Capital) and Section 32 (Increase of Nominal Capital) of the Dudley Brierley Hill & District Gas Order 1931 to be varied so as to authorise the raising of additional capital to an amount of £37,500 and the increase of the nominal capital of the Company by the same amount, and

Section 33 (New capital to rank with existing capital of same class) of the same Order to apply to the additional capital so authorised.

Section 2 (Borrowing Powers) of the Dudley Brierley Hill & District Gas (Borrowing Powers) Order 1938 to include the additional share capital authorised with such ancillary amendments of the Dudley Brierley Hill & District Gas (Borrowing Powers) Order 1938 as are necessary to secure the priority of mortgages granted by the Company before the date of the Order now applied for and the priority of money raised on mortgage or by the issue of debenture stock under the provisions of the proposed Order over other claims on account of debts incurred or engagements entered into after the date of such Order.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the application may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 12th day of July, 1940. Any such objection shall state the specific grounds of objection and a copy of the objection shall be forwarded to the Applicants, or to the undersigned, at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.
