HIS Morning was held a Confistory, in which the Pope performed the Ceremony of Shutting and Opening the Mouths of the Cardinals Arquin and Morigia. The vacant Arch-Bishoprick of Milan is not yet disposed of; The Pope, it's said, has offered it to Cardinal Morigia, but he is unwilling to accept of it, because of the ill State of his Health. The Points of Ceremony between the Queen-Dowager of Poland and the Cardinals being agreed, the has been visited by Cardinal Spada Chief Minister to the Pope, and by the Cardinal de Bouillon, who acts here at present as Ambassador of France, and Cardinal Giudici, who does the like for the Crown of Spain, and by several other Cardinals. The Queen continues as yet incognite, and is attended when she goes abroad by Prince Odeschales's Coaches and Servants; but it's faid, the intends thortly to appear in Publick with a very iplendid Equipage. None of the Ambassadors here have yet visited her, because they demand the same Treatment that is given to the Cardinals, which being denied them, they have wrote to their several Masters, that they may receive their Orders thereupon. The Emperor having lately given the Title of Royal Highmest to the Great Duke of Tuscany, we hear the Marquis of Vitelli is coming from Florence to Notifie the same to the Pope and College of Cardimals, and to desire they will likewise give the Great Duke this Title; It's faid, he will bring with him the Cap of the Cardinal of Medici, his Eminency intending to divest himself of that Dignity, and to marry the Princess of Guastalla, by reason the Great Prince and Prince Gaston, his Nephews, have his have birthered and Times. have hitherto no Issue.

Venice, April 18. The Duke of Mantua has bought the Palace in this City that belonged to the late General Zen, and it's said, the Dutchess of Mantua intends to come and reside here. The time for which the Office of General of the Forces of Dalmatia was given to Signior Mocenigo being expired, the Senate will meet to morrow to appoint one to succeed him. Signior Priuli arrived here this week from Zant. By a Ship come in from Napoli di Romania we have Advice, that she Chevalier Delfino was failed from thence with 8 Men of War for Corfou; and the rest of the Fleet continued in that Port. The John and Laurence, and the Bimbow Galley, arrived this week from Ireland. Yesterday sailed from hence the Unity,

and the Mazarine Galley, bound for Zant.

Madrid, April 15. The King of Spain intends, towards the latter end of this Month, to remove to Aranguez for the benefit of the Air. The Duke the Moles having defired to be excuted from going with the Character of Ambassador to the

thereunto, and has given him the Office of President of the Supreme Council for the Affairs of Italy. Baron Berlipi, whom the King has made choice of to go to Vicima with the Character of his Envoy Extraordinary to Congratulate the King and Queen of the Romans on their Marriage, is made Councellor of the Supreme Council for the Affairs of Flanders; He is to take his way by Bruffels to make the Compliments of Condoleance to the Elector of Bavaria on the Death of the Electoral Prince, his Son. The Government of Porto Mahon is given to Don Juan Zepeda; the Office of Chancellor, in the Royal Council of the West-Indies, to Don Antonio d'Arrangen and Zubiate; and that of Councellor of Granada ro Don Emanuel Calvo. Don Juan de Navarro, General of the Order de la Mercede, is lately made a Grandee of Spain. Admiral Aylmer, with the Squadron of Men of War under his Command, failed from Cadiz on the 30th of the last Month, and on the 4th Instant was at Fungerol near Malaga, and intended to fail from thence the day following for Algiers.

Corunna, April 25. The Spanish-Expedition Pag-quet-boat arrived here the 22d Instant in three days from Falmouth. Yesterday sailed from hence, the Joseph Ketch, James Morton Master, and the Warren, William Oliver Master, from the Canaries; and the Hopewell, John Canaby Master, from Lisbon; being all three bound for London. The Letters from Oporto say, divers English Merchant-ships sailed thence some days before for Newfoundland. They write from Malaga, that Admiral Aylmer passed by that Place the 5th

Instant going for Algiers.

Warsaw, April 15. The King of Poland has writ to the Crown-General and the Great-General of Lithuania, to defire they will come hither, that he may consult with them about several Matters relating to the Forces of this Crown. We hear, that at some of the Provincial Diets the Gentry have resolved to appear in a Body at the General Diet, which is to meet here on the 16th of June next. They write from Lemberg, that the Bassa of Caminiec, and the other Commanders of the Turkish Forces on that Frontier, have forbid the Tartars to make any Incursions into the Territories of Poland; That all Things are now very quiet in those Parts, and the Inhabitants on the Borders of Rustand have begun to sow their Land which have lain untilled during the War.

Vienna, April 18. It's believed, the Imperial and Turkish Commissioners have by this time begun their Conferences for fettling the Limits in Hungary, and so soon as this is done, several small Places will be delivered up on both sides pursuance to the late Treaty. Directions are fent to Hungary for repairing the Fortifications of Effeck, Peter-Court of Portugal, the King has consented Waradin, Arath, and Buda, and several Regiments
