Green shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Byers Green.

"Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Durham has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of July, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

words and figures following, that is to say:-"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain

improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Peterborough:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Claude Martin, now Bishop of Peterborough, is desirous that certain works should be executed at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars and we have specified our general approval thereof:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient. that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid works a sum of \pounds 130 should be provided by way of advance from us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be repaid out of the emoluments of the Bishopric of Peterborough:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Claude Martin, Bishop of Peterborough (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow and that we be authorised to advance and pay to him a sum of £130, and that the whole or any part or parts of the said sum of £130 so to be advanced shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said works, and that such sum of £130 shall be repaid with interest thereon as hereinafter mentioned, in the manner following, that is to say, during the period of ten years from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, the said Bishop or his successors shall at the end of each year pay to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, one-tenth part of the said principal sum of f_{130} and shall also at the end of each year pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said princi-. pal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid or alternatively it shall be permissible for us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to provide for the repayment of the said sum of £130 and interest thereon or on outstanding balances, as aforesaid, by way of a yearly deduction during the said period of ten years from the annual sum, payable by us to the said Bishop of Peterborough and his successors.

"Provided that if the Bishop shall at any time pay to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, the whole or any part of the sum borrowed with interest to the date of such repayment, the liability for repayment resting upon the Bishop and his successors shall be thereupon cancelled or reduced.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.
