WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 8th day of August, 1940 (N.12553/40), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council of 26th May, 1925, sanction was given to the establishment of conditions of service for men of the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service and it was provided that their rates of pay, which include an element of Provision Allowance, should be subject to revision in the event of the rate of Provision Allowance for the Active Service falling below 2s. 1d. per diem:

“And whereas there are no regulations governing the situation arising when the Active Service rate of Provision Allowance rises above 2s. 8d. per diem:

“And whereas we are of opinion that when the rate of Provision Allowance for the Active Service is raised to 2s. 9d. per diem the emoluments of men of the Royal Naval Shore Signal

Service should be raised by 1d. per diem and thereafter follow any further increases of Provision Allowance for the Active Service, thus maintaining the 7d. lag which existed originally:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us to make payment accordingly, with effect from the 1st April, 1940.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas we consider it desirable that Leading Seamen who form part of the complement of Motor Torpedo Boats should be eligible for the rating of Motor Boat Coxswain under the same conditions as apply to Chief Petty Officers and Petty Officers:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the extension of the non-substantive rate of Motor Torpedo Coxswain to Leading Seamen, with pay at the rate of 6d. per diem.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated:— Cattle plague, or rinder-pest (*pestis bovina*) 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*) 1898; sheep pox (*variola ovium*) 1850; rabies 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*) 1906; and glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*) 1928. Dourine (*exanthema costale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.

No case of Fowl Pest (*pestis avium*) has been confirmed in Great Britain since the 11th January, 1937, the date as from which the disease was first notifiable. So far as is known, however, Fowl Pest has not existed in Great Britain since 1933.
