Madrid, April 24. N. S.

THE King of Spain continues in good Health, and went publickly to Chapel on the Easter Holidays in the usual manner; Their Catholick Majesties design to go and pass a few days at the *Buen Retiro*, having put off their intended Journey to *Aranjuez* upon the Advice of the Physicians, who do not like the Air of that Place. The Duke de *Sesto*, Son to the Marquis de *los Balbafes*, is appointed to be Ambassador from this Crown to the Pope. Count *Berlipi*, whom the King has chosen to go as his Envoy Extraordinary to the Court at *Vienna*, to Compliment the King and Queen of the *Romans* on their Marriage, intends to begin his Journey thither to morrow; He is afterwards to go to *Brussels*, to make the Compliment of Condoleance to the Elector of *Bavaria* on the Death of the Electoral Prince. The Marquis de *Malpica*, Gentleman of the King's Bedchamber, died here yesterday, and is succeeded by the Marquis of *Mirabel*, his Brother. The Places of Superintendent of the King's Revenues, and President of the Council of the *West-Indies*, are not yet disposed of. The *Flota* designed for *New-Spain* will depart from *Cadiz* about the beginning of *June* next, and is to consist in 14 Sail of Ships, the Command of which is given to *Don Manuel de Velasco*. Our last Accounts from *Ceuta* say, the *Moor*s continue before that place, but proceed so faintly in their Attacks, that we may believe they are grown very weary of the Siege; They have not of late fired so many Bombs into the Town as they used to do, and the Besieged have discovered, that most of the Mortars they made use of are burst; In the mean time, the *Spaniards* are finishing their new Works without the Town.

Rome, April 25. This Court is very well pleased with the Account they have received from *France*, That the Arch-Bishop of *Cambray* has so readily submitted to the Pope's Bull for condemning his Book. The Pope has made Cardinal *Morigia* Arch-Priest of *Santa Maria Maggiore*, and has given a very rich Abbey in the Ecclesiastical State to Cardinal *Nogroni*, in lieu of the Bishoprick of *Favenza*, which he resigned some time ago. The Imperial Ambassador has received an Express from *Vienna*, to acquaint him that the Emperor has made him Captain of his Guard of Archers, and 'tis said, he has Orders to return home so soon as the Pope will admit him to his Audience of Leave; Neither his Excellency, nor any of the other Ambassadors at this Court, have yet visited the Queen of *Poland*, by reason she refuses to receive and treat them in all respects like the Cardinals, which, she alledges, is without Precedent; and they are expecting Directions from their several Masters concerning this Matter.

Venice, May 1. Signior *Sfondra*, Fiscal of the Province of *Dalmatia*, is gone from hence with a Droggerman for the *Levant* to assist Signior *Grimani*, the Commissioner appointed by this Republick for settling the Limits between the *Venetian* and *Turkish* Territories, who, according to our last Advices from *Dalmatia*, was arrived at *Zara*, and intended forthwith to repair to the Frontiers, where the *Turkish* Commissioners are to meet him. Signior *Girolamo Venier* made his Entry into this City on Monday last as Procurator of *St. Mark*; and Signior *Bragadino*, who is preferred to the same Dignity, will make his Entry on Monday next. We have an Account from *Constantinople*, that the Grand Visier was come thither, and had caused the Peace to be Proclaimed, to the great Satisfaction of all the Inhabitants of that City; And the Sultan himself was shortly expected there from *Andrinople*.

Vienna, May 2. The Difference with the *French* Envoy, the Marquis de *Villars*, is at last made up, the Prince of *Lichtenstein* having met the Envoy, and made his Excuses to him for what passed at the Ball in the Arch-Duke's Apartment; And 'tis said, that the Count of *Sinzendorf*, whom the Emperor has appointed to be his Envoy at the *French* Court, has received Orders to prepare for his Journey thither. Count *Osting* has given Directions for hastening the Preparations that are making in order to his Embassy to the Grand Signior, intending to begin his Journey about the beginning of the next Month; And we hear, the Sultan has named the Bassa of *Belgrade* to come with the Character of his Ambassador Extraordinary to this Court. The Emperor intends to go on the 8th Instant to *Laxemburgh*, and 'tis said, that after some stay there, the Court will remove to *Presburgh*, where the States of the Kingdom of *Hungary* are to meet the next Month. Cardinal *Collonitz* is returned from thence, as is the Bishop of *Raab* from *Raab*. The Count of *Brandois*, Counsellor of State and High-Steward to the Arch-Duchess *Elizabeth*, died here last Sunday. They write from *Hungary*, that the Conferences for settling the Limits between the Emperor and the Grand Signior's Dominions were begun at *Salankemen* on the 17th past, and continued with good Success. The Auxiliary Troops that have served in *Hungary* are preparing to return home.

Cologne, May 12. The Canons of this Chapter, who were deprived on account of their adhering to the Cardinal of *Furstenberg* during the late War, are restored pursuant to the Treaty of *Ryswick*, which provides, That they shall enjoy their former Rights and Dignities jointly with the Persons who were chosen into their Places, but on condition nevertheless, That the Revenues of the said Prebendaries shall solely belong to those that are pre-

present in Possession thereof, till their Death, or voluntary Resignation; in which case, the former Canons are to succeed them, or to be put into such other Prebendaries as shall become vacant in the mean time. The Sieur de *Phlpeaux*, Envoy from France, is gone from hence to the Bathes at *Aix la Chapelle*. The Baron of *Griez*, Envoy from the Elector of *Hanover*, went from this Place yesterday for *Coblenz*. The Elector Palatine intends shortly to go from *Duseldorp* to *Aix la Chapelle*, and it's said, that after some stay there, he will go to *Heydelbergh*. The Conferences for regulating the Tolls or Customs, to be taken by the several Princes whose Dominions lie along the *Rhine*, from the Boats that pass along that River, were begun here yesterday.

Brussels, May 14. The Deputies from the several Cities of *Brabant* are to meet here on the 16th Instant, to consider of the Proposals for making the new Canal from *Ostend* to the *Scheld*. The Marquis of *Conflans* has surrendered his Government of *Aeth*, which is given to the Count of *Liberehy*. The Baron of *Bomgarden*, High Steward to the Electors of *Bavaria*, is gone from hence for *Germany*; and in the mean time that Place is officiated by the Count de *Coffe*. Abbot *Seffani*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of *Hanover*, has left this Place, in order to make a Journey to *Ben* and *Duseldorp*.

Hague, May 15. The States-General have received a Letter from the King of *Denmark*, to acquaint them, That he has ordered a Gathering to be made throughout his Dominions for the Protestants that are banished out of *Piedmont*, and that he intends to permit them to come and settle in the Kingdom of *Denmark*. They also received a Letter from the Elector of *Bavaria*, desiring they would give Leave for the Exportation of some Corn from these Provinces into the Duchy of *Brabant*, which has been complied with. The States of *Holland* and *Wissfriseland* are to meet on the 20th Instant, when the Deputies from the Colleges of the Admiralty are also to assemble here, to finish the Matters relating to the Marine Regiments they intend to form. Monsieur *Han*, who resided on the part of this State at the Court of the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, is returned from *Berlin*, and was this day in the Assembly of the States-General, to give them an Account of his Negotiations.

Paris, May 16. N. S. The Earl of *Jessey*, Ambassador Extraordinary from His Majesty of *Great-Britain*, went hence this day for *Calais*, in order to embark there for *England*. A new Declaration made by the King was yesterday Registered in Parliament, by which (the better to prevent the French Protestants from departing out of this Kingdom) it is ordered, that for the space of Three years they shall not be permitted to dispose of their Goods or Estates, or to Pawn or Mortgage them. Pursuant to the King's Letter to the Arch-Bishop in this Kingdom, Requiring them to assemble their suffragan Bishops to receive the Pope's Bull for condemning the Arch-Bishop of *Cambray's* Book, a Provincial Assembly was held here this week for the Arch-Bishoprick of *Paris*, at which were present the Arch-Bishop, the Bishops of *Meux*, *Chartres*, and *Blois*, and the Dean of the Cathedral of *Orlans*, who having examined the said Bull, resolved to receive it, and that each of them in his particular Dioceses should put out a Mandate for publishing the same. The Marquis de *Ferrero*, Ambassador from the Duke of *Savoy*, had Audience of the King on Tuesday last, when he acquainted, that the Dutchess of *Savoy* was delivered on the 6th Instant of a Prince, who was Christened by the Name of *Philip-Joseph*; And the Count de *Tess*, first Gentleman of the House to the Dutchess of *Burgundy*, is named to go and Compliment the Duke and Dutchess of *Savoy* on this occasion. Monsieur de *Vauban* has Orders to visit all the Fortified Places along the Sea-Coast from *Dunkirk* to *Cherbourg*.

Plimsouth, May 7. His Majesty's Ship the *Redoubtable* came in here on the 25th Instant from the *Canary*, and likewise His Majesty's Ship the *Wanderer* from *Canary*, and they both sailed again this day to the *Eastward*. It is also arrived here the *Cock* of this place, *Stephen* of *Matte*, from *Virginia*.
