quarters of a mile of the Control Room. Here he was thrown off his motor cycle by falling bricks. Although temporarily dazed, he managed to remount, but was blown off his cycle by a bomb, and rendered unconscious. When he recovered he insisted on continuing and despite being again blown off his machine, he finished the remainder of the journey, about half a mile, on deflated tyres, the inner tubes having been burst as a result of the explosions. When he arrived in the Control Room the Medical Officer of Health examined him and ordered him to go home by car. Jenkins got out of the car before reaching his home and went back to his Post for further duty.
