"And whereas the Diocesan Committee of the Diocese of Coventry appointed pursuant to the first section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have by a Resolution passed at a meeting held on the 1st day of August, 1940, signified their consent to the alteration of

boundaries herein proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Mervyn, Bishop of Coventry (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said Parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry, and of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of that detached portion of the Parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry, which is known as the Holy Trinity Without, Coventry.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme

has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the detached portion of the Parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry, which is known as the Holy Trinity Without, Coventry, in the County of Warwick

and in the Diocese of Coventry, being: \_\_\_

"All that portion of the New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, in the said County and Diocese which is bounded upon the east by the said detached portion of the Parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry, upon the south by the Parish of Baginton, upon a part of the west by the Parish of Stivichall, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the west and upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Stivichall from the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, at the junction of the River Sherbourne with the stream which flows into that river past the southwestern side of Whitley Common and extending thence generally north-eastward along the middle of the River Sherbourne for a distance of 47 chains or thereabouts to a point in the centre of Whitley Bridge which carries London Road across the said river and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of London Road for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the south-western end of the fence forming the northwestern boundary of the close numbered 188 upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme and extending thence first north-eastward and

northern boundary of the said close to its eastern end and extending thence in a straight line for a distance in all of 18 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, from the said detached portion of the Parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Coventry has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the
