Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn, of the New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, and of the New Parish of Saint Silas, Blackburn, all in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn:

"Whereas District Chapelries have been assigned to the Church of Saint Mark, Witton, the Church of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, the Church of Saint Luke, Blackburn, the Church of Saint Philip, Griffin, and the Church of Saint Silas, Blackburn, by the Orders in Council the dates of which are stated in the 2nd column of the following Table:---

"And whereas the said District Chapelries have under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parishes should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parishes shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, and of the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn; (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and is thereon coloured yellow shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, and (thirdly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Mark, Witton, which

is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and is thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Silas, Blackburn.

And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

## " The First Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, in the said County and Diocese which lies to the north of the middle of the roads called Redlam Brow and Bank Top.

<sup>4</sup> 2. And also all that other portion of the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, which lies to the east of the middle of Perth Street.

3. And also all that portion of the New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, in the said County and Diocese which is bounded upon the north-west by the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south upon the south-east and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn, of the New Parish of Saint Aidan, Blackburn, in the said County and Diocese, and of the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, all meet on the western bank of the river Darwen and extending thence in a straight line due eastward for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Stansfeld Street and Thornber Street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Thornber Street for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Taylor Street and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Taylor Street for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the boundary which divides the London Midland and Scottish Railway from the backs of the houses and premises situate on the south-eastern side of Craig Street and extending thence north-eastward along the said wall or fence for a distance of  $14\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its north-eastern end and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Galligreaves Street on the south-western side of the bridge under the King Street Branch of the said railway.

And also all that other portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, which is bounded upon the northwest and upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke,
