Blackburn, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, at a point in the middle of Harrison Street on the north-eastern side of the bridge under the King Street Branch of the London Midland and Scottish Railway and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the middle of Harrison Street for a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn.

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, which is bounded upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, upon the south-east and upon the south-west partly by the said New Parish of Saint Aidan, Blackburn, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the northwest and upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, at a point in the middle of Preston Old Road and extending north-eastward along the middle of Preston Old Road for a distance of $25\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Spring Lane and with the road called Redlam and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Redlam for a distance of $26\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thompson Street and with the road called Redlam Brow and extending thence eastward along the middle of Redlam Brow for a distance of 15 yards or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, from the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin.

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, which is bounded upon the north-east by the said New Parish of Saint Silas, Blackburn, upon the north by the New Parish of Saint Mary, Mellor, upon the west by the New Parish of Immanuel, Feniscowles, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Immanuel, Feniscowles, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, at a point in the middle of Billinge End Road and extending thence first eastward and then northeastward along the middle of Billinge End Road for a distance of 63 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, from the said New Parish of Saint Silas, Blackburn."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Blackburn.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 10th day of October, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94 Chapter 94, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Paul, Middlesbrough, and of the New Parish of Saint Columba, Middlesbrough, both in the County and Diocese of York:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 16th day of January, 1873, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Paul, situate in the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Middlesbrough, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul,

Middlesbrough ':

'And whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the 12th day of March, 1903, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Columba, Middlesbrough, situate in the New Parish of All Saints, Middlesbrough, in the said County and Diocese, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Columba, Middlesbrough':
