Vesterday arrived here a G-nerse Back in 20 dayes from Turk, informing us, that at Pono Farina un of their flips lay ready fitted up for the Grand Segniors fervice, and 3 others to cruile upon the *Mediterangen*, and that a few dayes be ore their departure one of their ips returned into Port, bringing in a French Bark laden with Corn From Tabarca , having abourd her as perfons, whom they put to the Oar and fold afterwards

for Slaves. They farther tell us, that about 30 dayes fince Monfieur Durante's French man, who refided at Tunis as Conful or Refident from His Molt Chriftian Majefty, was feiled upon infpirion of holding a private correspondency with the Moors about Tripoly , inviting them to make war upon Junis, and pellwading drin that the French would be res-dy at the Spring to affilt them with a ftrong Fleet; which to incented them, that after they had dragged him about the Streets, and broken the bones of his Legs, Thighs, and Arms, they burnt him yet alive near the Houle of the English Conful, burning allo a Moor whom they had feiled and charged with the carrying of Letters to this effect.

This day arrived here the Dutch Convoy f om Holland and Cadi?, having on their way touched at Cagliari in Sa dignas they are onely fix merchant thips and one man of war, and my fuddenly proceed for smirns and Scanderoon.

The Affrican is departed hence for Cyprus and Scan, deroon, and the Pittory for Smirna. which later may in few dayes be followed by the Mary and Guiny. The Lucas and divers other thips are bound lience and may fuddenly depart for Puglia.

Verice Mart. 16. Lenets from Legorn inform us of the prrival there of a vellel in few days from the Archipelago, affirming that in Candia the Garifon is daily in action with the Turks, either defending themfelves against their aslaults, or revenging them by their fallies which they frequently make with fuccels, and return with many heads of their Enemies, and loofe no time or opportunities of repairing the breaches made by the Bnemies Cannon.

They farther fays that the Grand Vifier being informed that the greater part of the French adventurers were reimbarked and returned homewards, immediately called a Council of his Officers, where after a long debate it was selolved, that the Army thould be drawn out, and that an affault should be made at the same time upon the Bulwa ks

Sabioners and St. Andre, hoping that the departure of the French might have much a hated the courage of the belieged, and opened a way to them for an eafie and speedy Lonquest; and accordingly 40.0 men were appointed in the night at each place, to fall on with all the tury imaginable, which they put into execution, and for two hours continued the affault with much obstinacy, but they found such warm entertainment in both place', that defpairing of fuccels, they retreated to their pofts, leaving the ground covered with their dead, and carrying off a great number of wounded men, the felieged having not in this alfault loft above forty men

Three Renegado Turks which fled into the Town of Candia inform that the Visier has not in his Camp above 20 thousand mer, and of these, many bundreds wounded or fick, and unfit for fervice, but that he fuddenly expected a recruit from Scios of 6000 men , for whole transportation there attended them leveral fluips of Barbary, and lome Beiler Gallies; where allo waited divers Saichs laden with Provisions, defigned for the Camp, whole wants and

necefli ies whe very urgent, They farther affirm, that our Admiral being informed of their intentions to put to fea, had fent out a confiderable fquadron of his men of war to attend them on their paffages to endeavour to intercept the Saichs, and if possible to enter gage the men of War and Gallies.

On Monday last arrived here the remaining part of the Lunenbourg forces, who were immediately Muffered and entred into pay, and will be speedily embarked on the Convoy defigned for *Candia*. The Senare has lately ordered the raifing of 600 Horfe in *Terratic analy* which are to be transported also for *Candia*, and stand with the 200 Horfe which are already there, incoming this Summer with the affishance promifed from the total, this most Christian Majelty, and puber Princes, to form a Body of an Army in the later form the two incoming the second secon that Kingdom, with which they intend to oppose the Visier, and if by any means they can, oblige him to raile his

Siege. Fruffils, Mart. 24. Letters from Frankfort f the 20th inftant inform us, that the Elector Palatine is with all his Family returned from Manheim to Heidlebourg.

From Nancy we are told, that the Duke of Lorrain having a defire to re-eftab ish Trade within his juriidiction, which has

has been much interrupted by the late wars, has published an Arrest or Decree, declaring that for the future no perion should be obliged to pay Cuftom according to the quality of their Merchandiles, but thould be rated in the grolle, vist each Waggon laden to pay 3 kiu es, 8 Solz, and 6 Denies, French & oney-endreach laden Cart 2 Librers 11 Solz, and 6 Deniers of the fame Money at their entry, or going out, without keing obliged to unlade, or to submit to any fearch, promiting fecurity and free passing through his Countrey of Lorrain and Barre to all forts of Merc, and so what Nation feevers, without any farther duties to be require. from them
