Durante's French man, who resided at Tunis as Consul or Resident from His Most Christian Majesty, was seised upon suspirion of holding a private correspondency with the Moors about Tripoly inviting them to make war upon Tunis; and pellwading them that the French would be ready at the Spring to affelt them with a ftrong Fleet; which so incensed them, that after they had dragged him about the Streets, and broken the bones of his Legs, Thighs, and Arms, they burnt him yet alive near the House of the English Conful, burning also a Moor whom they had seised and charged with the carrying of Letters to this effect.

Verice Mart. 16.
