A PROCLAMATION

IN ORDER TO THE ELECTING TWO PEERS OF SCOTLAND.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Reginald Bethune, Earl of Lindsay, and the Right Honourable Albert Kirby, Baron Fairfax of Cameron, were duly elected and returned to be two of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland to sit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and are since deceased: In order to the Electing two Peers of Scotland to sit in their room, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at the Palace of Holyroodhouse, at Edinburgh, on Wednesday, the eighth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one, at twelve o'clock Noon to nominate and choose two Peers of Scotland to sit and vote in the House of Peers in this present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, in the room of the said Reginald Bethune, Earl of Lindsay, and the said Albert Kirby, Baron Fairfax of Cameron, deceased, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law); and the Lord Clerk Register or the Principal Clerk of Session or, in the absence of both these Officers

from any cause, such person as may be designated for the purpose by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, is hereby required to attend such Meeting, and to take the Votes of the said Peers, and immediately after such Election made and duly examined to certify the Names of the Peers so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns of Scotland, Ten Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such Election.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this nineteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty, and in the fifth year of Our Reign.

Awarded the Military Cross.

Flying Officer Dougan Arthur Robert ELLIOTT (40812).

One morning in August, 1940, this officer was on duty as navigation officer in the operations room of an aerodrome during an intense enemy bombing raid. The roof of this building was demolished, and a number of casualties occurred. Flying Officer Elliott, though slightly wounded and badly shaken, went to the assistance of the wounded, removing the rubble with his hands and directing the rescue party. Being the only officer left of the operations room staff, he organised a party to recover as many maps and documents as possible and set up a skeleton organisation in the signals office. Going without food or rest he acted as controller until late at night when he was relieved. He showed great initiative and an exemplary sense of discipline and leadership.

Awarded the Military Medal.

88187 Corporal Bruce JACKMAN.

When a severe bombing attack developed at an aerodrome, Corporal Jackman ran to a gun post which he knew was manned by a less experienced crew. He retained one airman and ordered the others to take cover. He then operated the twin Lewis guns with great courage and determination until the gun post was demolished and he was severely wounded. Corporal Jackman's magnificent courage in the face of extreme danger merits the highest praise.

610976 Aircraftman 1st Class Frederick WILSON.

Aircraftman Wilson was a member of the crew of a high speed launch which rescued some 14 injured men from three ships of a convoy which were burning furiously. Later, when attempting the rescue of personnel from two planes, which had fallen into the sea, the launch was attacked by nine enemy single engine biplanes. The enemy raked the launch with machine gun fire and three fires were started by incendiary bullets. The wireless operator was killed, the man at the wheel had two bullets through his clothing and the master was knocked unconscious. Aircraftman Wilson seized the wheel and kept control of the launch in the heat of the action, until the master returned. During the action a line fell overboard and fouled the propellers. As they could not be cleared, Aircraftman Wilson, in spite of the rough sea, went over the side with a bowline and endeavoured to clear them. This Aircraftman behaved in a most praiseworthy manner under the most difficult conditions.

917343 Aircraftman 2nd Class Anthony Douglas ROWE.

During a dive bombing attack on a station, this airman manned one of two Hispano cannons with great skill and coolness, and thus shared in the destruction of at least two enemy aircraft. He remained at his self-appointed post during the whole of the action, without any cover and undeterred by bombs which were exploding some thirty yards away. He was deliberately machine-gunned from the air, but continued to handle his gun until the raid was over. Aircraftman Rowe showed courage, initiative and skill of a very high order.

882135 Corporal Josephine Maude Gwynne (ROBINS, Women's Auxiliary Air Force.

Corporal Robins was in a dug-out which received a direct hit during an intense enemy bombing raid. A number of men were killed and two seriously injured. Though dust and fumes filled the shelter, Corporal Robins immediately went to the assistance of the wounded and rendered first aid. While they were being removed from the demolished dug-out, she fetched a stretcher and stayed with the wounded until they were evacuated. She displayed courage and coolness of a very high order in a position of extreme danger.
