Esterday passed by this Port, the Reward, Capt. Bennet Commander, who came in 24 days from England, bound to Smyrna; and this day the Bolion, Capt. Peacock, bound to Zant and Alexandria. The Ann, Capt. Ryder Commander, came in here from Leghorne, bound to Lipari, and the Edward and Dudley, Capt. Lambert, bound to Venice, who in his Passage hither met the Squadron of Men of War commanded by Admiral Aylmer off

Calari, going for Tunus.

The Pope held a private Con-Rome, May 22. fistory on Monday last, in which the Bull for an Universal Jubilee for the year 1700, was examined, and ordered to be published. Signior Archinto was then declared Archbishop of Milan, and a Letter ordered to be writ to him ro recall him from the Court of Spain, where he resides at pre-sent as Nuncio from the Pope. The Ambassador of Tulcany has been Complimented by the College of Cardinals on his Arrival here; He is preparing for his Publick Entry, and the Pope has ordered, that he be received with the same Honours that were paid to the Marquis Piccardy, who was fent from the Court of Florence in the same Quality to Pope Clement the Ninth. But 'tis not believed the Pope will comply with the Great Dake's defire, of being treated with the Title of Royal Highness. 'Tis reported, that this Ambaliador is likewise charged with another Commission, which is, to refign the Cap of Cardinal Medicis, who, feeing his two Nephews have no Issue, has thoughts of marrying. Cardinal Giudici has acquainted the Pope, that he has Orders from the King of Spain to act as his Ambassador at this Court, and he has left his own Palace, and is gone to that where the Ambassadors of Spain usually reside. The Queen-Dowager of Poland has not yet appeared in Publick, but will do so in few days, her Equipage being now ready. The Cardinal d'Arquien, her Father, has received the Compliments from the College of Cardinals, and of the Persons of Quality that are in Town, upon his Promotion to that Dignity. Signior Erizzo, Ambassador from Venice, is daily expected here from Civita-Vecchia. The Pope The Pope continues his Refolution of going in few days to Nettuno, to fee the Works that are making for the Improvement of the Port of Anzo.

Venice, May 29. The Convoy for the Levant failed on Minday last, having on board a very considerable Sum of Money, and a great quantity of Provisions and Ammunition for the Service of the Venitian Forces in those Parts. The Archbishop of Corinth, with some of his Clergy who were here, have taken this opportunity to return to the Places of their Residence, as divers other Persons have likewise done, to whom the Senate have given the Government of Places, and other Employments

in the Morea. It's faid, the Senate have fent Directions for the demolishing of Lepanto, Prevesa, and such other Places which are to be restored to the Turks pursuant to the Treaty of Peace, that they may be evacuated as soon as the Limits shall be settled by the Commissioners, who are met for that purpose on the Frontiers of Dalmatia. The Edward and Dudley, Capt. Lambert Commander, arrived here last Securdar Frontiers

rived here last Saturday from England.
Vienna, May 30. The Arch-Duke Charles has been much inditposed this week, having had several Fits of an Ague, but is now very well again. The Emperor has made Count Volkart of Conzin High Steward to the Arch-Dutchess Mary-Elizabech, in the Place of the late Count Brandeis. An Express is fent to Count Marsigli, and the other Imperial Commissioners for settling the Limits between the Emperor's and the Grand Signior's Terrirories, with rurther Directions concerning the Boundaries of the Province of Groatia, which they are now regulating with the Turk sh Commissioners, being met for this purpose at Brod. The King of Polana's Minister at this Court has defired the Emperor's Leave, that some Regiments of the King his Master's Forces may march through Silefia, in their way from Poland to Saxon; which is granted, and Orders are accordingly fent to the Imperial Officers in that Province. We hear from Hungary, that the Magazines at Buda and Effect are filling with Provitions, for the Service of the Troops that are to be employed this Summer in making the new Fortifications in those Parts. Prince Eugene of Savey will be going thither about a week hence, to give Directions concerning these Works.

Francfort, June 7. Prince Lewis of Baden is shortly expected at Raztad, and from thence will go and visit the Fortifications of Kiel, Fribourg, and other Places situate in the Brisgau. A Body of the Elector Palatine's Troops are ordered to work on the Walls and Fortifications of Manbeim, which are now rebuilding. Two Regiments of Foot of His Electoral Highness's Forces passed lately by Meniz, marching towards the Palatinate. The Conferences at Cologne for regulating the Tolls along the Rhine being adjourned by reason of the Whitson Holidays, the Deputies, who assisted at the same on the part of this City,

are returning hither.

Brussels, June 10. The Elector of Bavaria is returned hither from Terveuren. The Count de Tirimont is come from Lisse, to take upon him the Chief Direction of the Publick Revenues in the Spanish Netherlands, which the Count de Bergeyck has lately quitted. The Deputies from the Cities of Flanders have renewed their Conference, to regulate Matters concerning the new Canal that is intended to be made from Ostend to the Scheld. The Burghers of this City are to meet to morrow, to consider of raising the Sura
