A Train of 24 Pieces of Cannon, and a considerable quantity of Provisions and Ammunition, were sent this week to *Caminiec* for the Service of that Garrison. The Commissioners who took Possession of that Place for the King of *Poland*, and who are likewise to receive from the *Turks* the Fortresses in *Podolia* and *Ukrania*, which are to be restored to this Crown pursuant to the late Treaty of Peace, are gone from *Caminiec*, in order to the further executing of their Commission, and Detachments are march'd from the Army of the Crown to Garrison those Places. The rest of the Forces of *Poland* which are encamped on this Frontier, are ordered to return to their Quarters, the Crown-General intending to go to *Warsaw* in few days, to assist at the General Diet which is to be held there next Month. The Princes *Alexander* and *Constantine*, Sons to the late King of *Poland*, who have continued here some time, will likewise leave this Place in a short time, and repair to *Warsaw*. The Diet of *Podolia* for choosing Deputies for the General Diet, will be opened this week at *Caminiec*, the Metropolis of that Province.

Warsaw, June 3. Divers of the Deputies from the Provincial Diets are already come hither, in order to the holding of the General Diet, which is to meet on the 16th of this Month. The Cardinal Primate is shortly expected here from the Baths in *Silesia*. The Senate are frequently assembled, to consider of several Matters to be laid before the General Diet. The Emperor having given his Consent, that the King's *German* Forces, which he has ordered to return to *Saxony*, may pass through *Silesia*, 10 Regiments have begun their march thither, and are already advanced as far as *Zacockzim* on the *Weyfel*, about 4 Miles from this City, where the Baron of *Bosen* is gone to take a Review of them. The King's Guards, and some other Regiments, are come into the Neighbourhood of this Place, where they are to encamp during the greatest part of the Summer.

Vienna, June 3. The Count of *Denhoff* is arrived here with the Character of Ambassador from the Elector of *Brandenburgh*. The Arch-Duke *Charles* being perfectly recovered of his late Indisposition, will return to-morrow to *Laxemburgh*, where the Imperial Court will continue about a week longer. It's said, that the Emperor, after his return from thence, will dispose of the vacant Offices of President of the Imperial Chamber, Chancellor of *Bohemia*, and General of the Artillery; which last, it's believed, will be given to the Count *Dhuan*, who is at present Lieut. Colonel of the Regiment commanded by-Count *Guido* of *Staremberg*.

Orders have been sent to the Imperial Troops in *Bohemia* and *Moravia* to march from their Quarters, in order to form a Camp of about 15000 Men in *Silesia*, and they are to continue together, while the *Saxon* Forces are marching through that Country in their return home from *Poland*. Orders are given for demolishing the Fortifications of *Brod*, and such other Places on the other side of the *Save* as are to be restored to the *Turks*.

Berlin, June 9. The Elector of *Brandenburgh* is returned hither from *Potsdam*, where he has spent some time. The Baron *Canitz*, who resided at the *Hague* as Envoy from this Court, returned hither this week; and Monsieur *d'Opdam*, who comes with the like Character from the States-General, is expected in 3 or 4 days, his Equipage being already arrived. Commissary *Plate* is gone from hence to *Magdebourg*, to take a Review of the Regiment of Horse of the Margrave of *Bareith*, which is ordered to march to *Prussia*.

Francfort, June 10. We have an Account from *Manheim*, that several Regiments of the Elector Palatine's Forces are come near that Place, where they are ordered to encamp during this Summer, and they will be employed in rebuilding the Fortifications of that City. Divers Families of the Protestants, who on account of their Religion are banished out of the Valleys of *Piedmont*, are come from *Switzerland*, in order to settle in the Territories of the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, and of the Princes of the Houses of *Hesse* and *Lunenburgh*. The Sieurs *Gunterroth* and *Kleck*, who are appointed to assist on the part of this City at the Conferences at *Cologne* for regulating the Tolls on the *Rhine*, are returned hither; The said Conferences being adjourned for some time.

Hague, June 16. On Friday the 12th Instant, in the afternoon, the King embarked on board the *William and Mary* Yacht in *Margate* Road, and landed the next day in the afternoon at *Oranie-Polder*, being attended in his Passage by a Squadron of Men of War under the Command of Sir *Cloudesty Shovell*. His Majesty supped at Monsieur *Rennenbourg's* at *Naaldwyck*, where divers Persons of Quality were to wait upon him; and about 10 at night His Majesty came to this Place. The 14th, His Majesty was complimented by the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Quality, on his safe Arrival. Yesterday His Majesty was present in the Assembly of the States-General, and this day in that of the States of *Holland*. His Majesty intends to go in the beginning of the next week to *Loo*. His Majesty has been pleased to appoint Mr. *Hill* to go his Envoy Extraordinary to *Savoy*, to make his Compliments of Congratulation at that Court upon the Birth of the Prince of *Piedmont*, and he is come hither from *Brussels*, to attend His Majesty before he begins his Journey.
