"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of St. Stephen, Bush Hill Park, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, being:—

" All that portion of the Parish of Edmonton, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north-east by the said New Parish of St. Stephen, Bush Hill Park, upon the north-west by the New Parish of Winchmore Hill, upon the west by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Winchmore Hill, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Winchmore Hill, from the said Parish of Edmonton at the junction of Firs Lane with Ridge Road and extending thence eastward along the middle of Ridge Road for a distance of 141 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Halstead Road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Halstead Road for a distance of II chains or thereabouts to its junction with Church Street and extending thence northward along the middle of Church Street for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Edmonton from the said New Parish of St. Stephen, Bush Hill Park.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of November, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal Residence belonging to the See of Worcester:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Arthur, now Bishop of Worcester, is desirous that certain works should be executed at the said Episcopal Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of the works and we have specified our general approval thereof:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the said works a sum of £180 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed under the authority of the Statutes hereinbefore mentioned for effecting improvements at the said Episcopal Residence does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by way of advance from us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be repaid out of the emoluments of the Bishopric of Worcester:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur, Bishop of Worcester (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow and that we be authorised to advance and pay to him a sum of £180 and that the whole or any part or parts of the said sum of £180 so to be advanced shall be applied by us at such time or times, and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said works and that such sum of £180 shall be repaid with interest thereon in the manner following, that is to say, during the period of three years from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, the said Bishop or his successors shall at the end of each year pay to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, one-third part of the said principal sum of £180 and shall also at the end of each year pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid or alternatively it shall be permissible for us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to provide for the repayment of the said sum of £180 and interest thereon or on outstanding balances as aforesaid by way of a yearly deduction during the said period of three years from the annual sum payable by us to the said Bishop of Worcester and his successors.
