Rome, May 30. N.S.

HE Marquis de Vitelli, Ambassador from the Great Duke of Tifiam, made his Publick Entry here on Sunday last; In which occasion, the Cardinal de Boullion's Coach took the first Placenex to that of the Ambasiador; And this caused a Dispute between the Cardinas's Servants, and those of the Count de Martiniiz, the Emperor's Amballador who were there with his Excellency's Coach and pretended to the Precedence, but the former being more numerous, kept their Rank, and the Servants and Coach of the Jatter went away, without and fing at the Entry. The Marquis de Vitelli being two days after to have his Publick Audience, this Dispute was like to be renewed, and both sides were putting them felves into a condition, by drawing together a great many Armed Men, to make good their Presentions; But to prevent the ill Confequences thereof, the Pope fo ordered the Matter, that the Ambassador of Tulcany's Audience was put off on pretence of his being indificofed, and the same will be deferred till this Matter can be accommodated, for which great Endeavours are used; and in the mean time the Parties concerned have sent to their respective Masters for further Directions in this Affair. Signior Erizzo, Ambassador from Veneze, acrived here last Thursday from Civita-Vecchia. The Bull for the Universal Jubilee, was published on Thursday last with found of Trumper, and other usual Ceremonies. The Pope has made Signior Filupicci his Auditor, and Prince Lewis della Mirandola, and Signior Anguisticla, Clerks of his Chamber. The Government of Givira-Vecchia is given to Signior Fosca-riui, and that of Perngia to Signior Patritio. Vinice, June 5. This Republick have lately taken a Resolution, to exclude from the Senate all those Noblemen who have Relations that enjoy any Offices or Benefices depending on the Pope, or who receive any Pensions from the Court of Rome. Signior Soranzo is preparing to leave this Place, in order to be going on his Embassy to Constantinople, so soon as the Limits between the Vinetian and Turkish Dominions are adjusted by the Commissioners that are assembled for that purpose on the Frontiers of Dalmatia. Divers Turkish Merchants are come hither from the Levant, in order to renew their Trade with the Vinetians. Our Magistrates have published an Order, for building out of this City all Beggars, or other idle Persons that are Foreigness, or cannot give

a good Account of themselves.

Historian, June 3. The Count of Lowenhoupt

gave a great Enterrainment last week to the King of Poland, and to divers other Persons of Principal Quality. This day the King went to the Camp that is forming near this Place, and reviewed three Regiments of Horse which are already arrived, and three Regiments of Foot are expected; and these six Regiments are to continue in the said Camp during the greatest part of the Summer. The Senate meet frequently, to consider of the Matters that are to be laid before the General Diet, which will be open'd here on the 16th Instant.

Vienus, June 6. The Archi Duke Charles returned to Laxemburgh on the 4th Inflant, where the Count de Dinheif, Ambessidor from the Ele-Etor of Brandenburgh, had Audience the fame day of the Emperor, as also of the King and Queen of the Romans, to whom he made the Compliments of Congratulation from the Elector his Master on their Marriage. A very fine Turnament was performed last week at Lax mburgh by the King of the Romans, and divers Persons of the fiest Quality; and on the 9th Instant, the Court are to be enterrained with a Comedy, a Ball, and other Diversions, it being the Emperor's Birth-The Count de Staremberg is appointed to go day. The Count de Staremberg is appointed to go again to Sueden with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, and will leave this Place in few days, in order to icpair to that Station; as will likewife Count Zeelenicki, the Emperor's Envoy to the King of Polund. It's faid, that Count Rabatin will shortly return to this Place from Transfluentia, and that Prince Philos of Lichtenthin is to be their this that Prince Philip of Lichtenstein is to be sent thither in his stead to command the Imperial Forces in that Province. Our Letters from Brod in Schvonia of the 24th past give an Account; that the Conferences between the Imperial and Turkish Commissioners for regulating the Limits were continued with very good Success; They had adjusted all Matters relating to the Frontiers of Sclavonia, and intended to remove in few days to Jessanoviz in Croatia, in order to fettle the Boundaries of that Province.

Francfort, June 14. Six Battalions of the Elector Palatine's Forces are already arrived at the Camp near Manheim, and five more are shortly expected, which are to be commanded by Major-General Rehbinder. We hear from Ausbeurg, that Prince Lewis of Baden is at present at that Place, and somewhat indisposed. The Duke of Saxe-Cobourg lies very ill at Watersucht. The Prince of Anhale, and the Duke of Saxe-Gotha, are gone to the Baths at Carelsbadt in Bohemia. It's said, the Margrave of Brandenburgh-Anspach is going to marry a Princess of the House of Dessay.
