Madrid, June 4. N. S.

THE King of Spain having on the 23d past sent an Order to the Almirante of Castile to retire 30 Miles from Court, he left this Place accordingly the next day, and went to *Villa-Vicosa*, being accompanied by the Duke of *Arcos* his Brother-in-Law, the Marquis de *Leche* his Nephew, and Don *Lewis de Toledo Osorio*; The 25th he went to *Aranjuez*, and yesterday proceeded on his Journey towards *St. Lucar in Andalusia*. It's said, the Countess of *Berlips*, a German Lady, who was much in the Queen's Favour, intends in a few days to return to Germany. The Marquis de *los Rios* designs to be going from hence this week on his Embassy to France. The Prisoners, who were in the Common Prison of this Place, to the number of about 60, broke out the last week, and taking the Crucifix from the Chapel belonging to the Prison, and the same being carried before them, they went to the Palace, to beg the King's Pardon for what they had done, pretending they were ready to be starved, but not being suffered to come into the Palace, they dispersed, and took Refuge in several Monasteries. There having been some Disorder in the Market, and other Places where Bread and Corn is sold, a Guard of Soldiers is ordered to be placed there, and in several Streets, to prevent the like for the future. At the same time all possible Care is taken to supply the People with Bread, which continues very scarce and dear here and in the neighbouring Country, and a considerable quantity of Corn is accordingly sent for from *Navarre* and *Galicia*. Our Letters from *Cadiz* say, the Ships designed for *New-Spain* were making ready with all possible diligence. They write from *Ceuta*, that the Moors continue the Siege of that Place, and have lately made some Attacks in order to ruin the new Fortifications which the Besieged have made without the Town, but were beaten off with Loss; and the Spaniards had sprung some Mines, which had done great Damage to the Enemy.

Genova, June 2. Signior *Francisco Maria Saveli*, Doge of this Republick, died on the 26th of the last Month; His Body lay in State 3 days, and was interred the 30th in the Cathedral of this City with the usual Ceremonies; And the Senate are to proceed on Monday next to the Election of a new Doge. The Squadron of Gallies commanded by the Duke of *Tursis*, arrived here this morning from *Naples*, and will proceed in few days to the Coast of Spain. The Prince of *Morano*, who goes with the Character of Ambassador Extraordinary from the Most Christian King to the Pope, is still here expecting the Gallies from

Marsilles, which are to carry him and his Retinue to *Civita-Vecchia*.

Dantzick, June 12. The Senate and Burghers of this City are to be assembled on Monday next, to make some Regulations touching the Exportation of Corn, and other Matters of Trade. The Elector of *Brandenburgh* is expected this Summer at *Couingsberg*. The Garrison of *Elbing* has been lately reinforced by a Body of his Electoral Highness's Forces, and Preparations are making, as well by the Crown of *Poland* as by the *Brandenburghers*, to put their frontier Places in a condition of Defence in case of a Rupture. Our Advices from *Warsaw* say, most of the Deputies from the Provincial Diets of *Poland* and *Lithuania* are arrived there, in order to the holding of the General Diet, which is to meet on the 16th Instant, and that, among other Instructions they have received from their several Palatinates, they are ordered not to separate before they have finished the Matters referred to their Consideration.

Vienna, June 10. Yesterday being the Emperor's Birth-day, who then entered into the 60th year of his Age, was observed with much Solemnity. The Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Quality, waited upon the Emperor at *Laxemburgh*, and made him the usual Compliments, and in the evening the Court was entertained with a Comedy, which was acted on a Stage built for that purpose in the Grove near the Palace, after which there was a Ball and a Consort of Musick. The Count de *Zedenicki*, Envoy from the Emperor to the King of *Poland*, is on his departure for *Warsaw*. Our Letters from *Hungary* say, the Commissioners for settling the Limits arrived on the first Instant at *Jassanovissa*, where they had a Conference and a long Debate concerning a Fort in a small Island in the *Save* near *Gradisca*, the *Turkish* Commissioners pretending it ought to be demolished, and the *Imperialists* insisting to keep the same in the condition 'tis at present. This Dispute was renewed at a Meeting they had the next day at *Debitz*, and the Commissioners not being able to adjust the Matter, they agreed to defer proceeding further therein, until they should receive new Orders from their respective Masters; and in the mean time to go on with regulating the Limits, for which purpose they were to meet again on the 3d Instant at *Constanza*.

Frankfurt, June 17. About 130. of the *Vaudois* that are banished out of *Piedmont* on account of their Religion, arrived here yesterday by Water from *Mentz*, and they are to continue their Journey to morrow towards the Dominions of the Landgrave of *Hesse-Cassel*, who has invited them to settle there, and granted them divers Privileges.
