Cadix, May 29. N.S. On the 25th Instant a Merchant Ship
arrived here from the Canaries, by which we have Ad-
vice, that a Dutch Ship was put in there from Cape Verde
and brought an Account, that the Admiral of the Buenos
Aires Ships, which sailed from hence the last day of
April 1698, with three others, was separated from the
rest on the 4th of May, and afterwards in Storms and
with contrary Winds failed till the 4th of December, when
they arrived at St. Jago, one of the Islands of Cape
de Verde, having lost their Commander, and some
other Officers, and about Sixty Seamen; The Spaniards
were kindly received by the Portuguese, and were
repairing the Damage their Ship had sustained, in order
to proceed on their Voyage. This evening two of the
Custom-house Boats belonging to this place were pursuing
a Boat in the Bay, which a French Ship called the Claudio
defended, by firing several Muskets at the said Custom-house
Boats, who fired likewise at the Ship, and rowing to-
wards the Shore, met the Captain of the said French Ship
going on board, whom they took out of his Boat in order
to bring him before the Governor; Whereupon some o-
ther French Boats who at the same time were going aboard,
and had seen part of the Action, went and demanded the
said Captain, whom the Spaniards would not deliver;
This at first created words, and at last they came to fight-
ing; in which Skirmish one Spaniard was killed, and
7 wounded, whereof their Commander is one; 2 French
Men were killed, and 2 French Captains of Ships mortally
wounded; and the Captain of the St. Claudio, who is
one of them, is since dead; and 2 Lieutenants, with 8 or 10
Seamen, were also wounded. The Spaniards were very
well provided with small Arms, and had Pedrocros which
did much Damage to the French; but the French plyed
them so warmly with Hand-Granadoes, that they were
forced to leave their Boats and wade to the Shore.

Maarid, June 10. The King of Spain is at present in
