Leghorne, June 12. N.S.

**B**y a *Tartane* which arrived here two days ago from *Tunis* we have an Account, that the Squadron of *English Men of War*, under the Command of *Admiral Aylmer*, came to an Anchor in that Bay in the beginning of the last Month; The *Bey of Tunis* was then in the Country, but as soon as he heard of their Arrival, he came to *Tunis* and went on board the *Boyne*, where he and his Attendance were nobly entertained, and a great many Guns fired by the Men of War. The *Bey* was extremely pleased, and gave *Admiral Aylmer* several *Turkish Horses*, and other Presents to the rest of the *English Commanders* and others; And as a further Demonstration of his Respect and Veneration for His Majesty of *Great-Britain*, and his Affection to the *English Nation*, he has taken off the 5 per Cent. the *English* paid before for the Merchandizes they imported there, and gave 50 *Christian Slaves* their Liberty, several of whom are come hither in the *Tartane* that brought this News, the rest remaining on board the *English Men of War*; And on the 30th of the last Month *Admiral Aylmer* sailed out of *Tunis Bay* for *Tripoli*.

*Warsaw*, June 16. The King of *Poland's* Guards, and some other *Saxon Regiment*, making together about 4000 Men, being arrived in the Neighbourhood of this place, began to encamp yesterday. The General Diet is appointed to meet to-morrow, but so few of the Deputies from the Provincial Diets are yet arrived, that it's believed their Meeting will be put off for some days longer. The Cardinal Primate is daily expected from *Silesia*, he has hitherto showed so great an Inclination towards maintaining the Peace between this Crown and the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, that 'tis not doubted but he will use his best Endeavours at the Diet to persuade them to accept of the Offer which the Emperor and some other Princes have made of their good Offices for accommodating the Affair of *Elbing*. They write from *Lemberg*, that the Army of the Crown have resolved to send Deputies to the Diet to solicit the Payment of their Arrears. The Commissioners appointed by the King to take Possession in his Name of the Fortress of *Caminiec*, and of several other Places in the Provinces of *Podolia* and *Ukrania*, continue still in those Parts to execute their Commission.

*Vienna*, June 17. The Emperor has named the Count *de Barca* to go as his Ambassador to the Republick of *Venice*. The Count *d'Osting* will not be going from hence on his Embassy to the Port till the latter end of *August*; this Court being desirous to tie the Limits between the *German* and *Turkish* Dominions settled, before he begins his Journey. The Count of *Daan*, Lieutenant-Colonel of the Regiment of *Staremberg*, is made Colonel of the Regiment of *Houchin*. 'Twas lately reported, that the Emperor intended to go this Summer to *Presbourg*, to call together a General Diet of *Hungary*; but if his Imperial Majesty had taken such a Resolution, he has since altered it, and has given Directions for the Deputies of the Estates of that Kingdom to repair hither, in order to make such Regulations as shall be thought necessary for the good of that Kingdom. A Body of 9000 Men of the Imperial Forces are sent to *Ara* to finish the Fortifications of that Place, and the rest of the Imperial Forces are likewise to be employed in making some new Fortifications at *Buda*, *Essack*, and other Frontier Places.

*Berlin*, June 23. The Elector of *Brandenburgh* returned hither yesterday from *Oraniebourg*, where he passed a few days. We are expecting what Resolutions will be taken in the General Diet of *Poland* about the Business of *Elbing*; In the mean time the Elector of *Brandenburgh* has received Advice, that 100000 *Muscovites* are actually on the Borders of *Smolensko*, and that their General has Orders from the Czar not to stay for any farther Directions from him, but to act according to the Instructions he shall receive from his Electoral Highness, and to make an Incurfion into *Lithuania* upon the first Notice he shall receive from the Elector, that any Hostilities are begun by the *Polanders* against his Subjects. Monsieur *d'Opdam*, Envoy Extraordinary from the States-General, arrived here some days ago. Monsieur *Dankelman* is lately dead at his House at *Halberstadt*.

*Hamburg*, June 26. The last Letters from *Poland* give an Account, that the General Diet of that Kingdom is put off till the 27th of this Month. Our Letters from *Dresden* of the 20th Instant give an Account, that the Queen of *Poland* was expected there that day from *Lichtenbourg*; and that there is no more talk of her going to *Poland*. Part of the *Saxon Forces* are shortly expected in *Saxony* from *Poland*, and Quarters and other Necessaries are accordingly provided for them. The Council which had the chief Direction of Military Matters in *Saxony* is broke, and it's said, the Management of those Affairs will be put into the hands of Commissioners, of which Major *Jordan*, who is now in *France* as Envoy from *Poland*, is to be one.

*Brussels*, June 27. The Burghers of this City have been assembled, and given their Consent to what has been already agreed on by the States of *Brabant*, concerning the Subsidies to be raised in this Country for the Service of this year. Mr *Hill*, whom His Majesty has appointed to make the Compliment of Congratulation at the Court of *Savoy* upon the Birth of the Prince of *Piedmont*, intends in 2 or 3 days to begin his Journey to *Turin*. The Baron *de Simoni*, Envoy Extraordinary to His Majesty of *Great-Britain* from the Elector of *Barvaria*, is returned hither from *England*.

*Dieren*, June 30. The King having hunted a Stag on *Saturday* last, returned hither in the evening; And the day following a great number of the Gentry of these Parts waited on His Majesty. His Majesty will stay here till the latter end of this week, and then return to *Loe*.

*Hague*, June 30. The States-General have resolved to form three Marine Regiments out of the Forces they have now on foot which are to be paid by the Admiralty. They have appointed the Heers *Cloufen* and *de Vique* to go as their Commissioners to *Mastricht*. The Sieur *Pretorius*, Envoy from the Duke of *Courland*, had a private Audience this day of the States-General. The Sieur

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**Telodanus**, Envoy from the Emperor of Morocco, arrived here this morning from Amsterdam, and is to have Audience of the States-General in few days. It's said, there will be a Review of the Forces of this State upon the *Voluwe* this Summer. The Count de *Tailard*, Ambassador from the Most Christian King, is arrived here from England.

Paris, July 1. N. S. The King went last Saturday to Marli. The Marquis de *Cascaes*, Ambassador from Portugal to this Court, hath received Orders to return home. Mr. *Stanyan*, Secretary to the Embassy from His Majesty of Great-Britain, arrived here last Sunday. They write from *Marseilles*, that 4 Gallies were gone from thence, under the Command of the Chevalier de *St. Luc*, to attend the Prince of Monaco (Ambassador from this Court to the Pope) in his Passage to *Civita-Vecchia*; That 15 Gallies commanded by the *Sieur Forville*, were failed for the Coast of Italy; and eight others under Command of the *Sieur Mauboisquet* for the Coast of Spain.
