THE Cardinal de Souillon had Audience of the Pope last Wednesday, to whom he made his Excuse for the Dispute that happened between his Servants and those of the Imperial Ambassadors at the Entry of the Ambassador of *Tuscany*. In the mean time, divers Inhabitants of this City that were seized for taking part in this Quarrel, continue in Prison. A particular Congregation was held here last week, composed of the Cardinals *Sporo, Puciatucci, Marsilotti, Abano* and *Sacripanti*, and four Auditors of the *Rota*, to consider of the Presentations which the Duke of *Saroy* makes to the Presentation of Vacant Abbeyes in *Piedmont*; and they are to meet again in a day or two. The Great Duke of *Tuscany's* Ambassador continues his Visits to the Cardinals and the publick Ministers, but has not yet waited upon the Queen-Dowager of *Poland*, by reason she continues still *incognito*. The Cardinal *d'Aquino* is now perfectly recovered of his late Indisposition. The Cardinal *d'Agliere* is dangerously ill of a Feaver. Abbot *Lelio Trapi*, a Native of *Florence*, and of one of the most considerable Families in that City, having an Information preferred against him in the Office of Inquisition, drew himself last week in the *Tiber*, to avoid being brought before that Tribunal. Signior *Casale* and Signior *Conci* are fined 2000 Crowns each, for having hindered the Custom-house Officers from searching their Coaches as they were entering into this City. Signior *Altoviti*, Captain of the Pope's *German* Guards, being lately dead, that Command is given to Major *Ceruti*.

Venice, June 19. Cardinal *Delfino*, who is at present here, lies very ill of a Feaver. The Senate have given notice to the Commanders of the *Venetian* Forces in the *Levant*, of the Resolution they have taken, to keep in Pay all the Officers that are at present in their Service; and that none of those Officers shall be allowed to be absent from their Commands without particular Leave. By a Merchant Ship come in here from *Dalmatia*, we have received this further Account of the Proceedings of the Commissioners, who are met on the Frontiers of that Province to settle the Limits between the *Venetian* and *Turkish* Territories. Signior *Grimani*, Commissioner from this Republick, being arrived at *Singh*, received a Compliment from the *Turkish* Commissioner who was at *Tranick* in *Bosnia*, with a Present of a very fine *Turkish* Horse; after which the *Venetian* Commissioner continued his Journey to *Sterizza*, the Place of Conference, where the *Turkish* Commissioner being arrived the same day, they made the usual Visits to each other, and on the 5th Instant exchanged their Powers, and began their Conferences, in which they have already made a good Progress.

Breslaw, June 17. Yesterday being the day appointed for the meeting of the General Diet of this Kingdom, the King, attended by the Nobility and the Deputies of the Palatinates that are in Town, went to the Cathedral Church, where Mass was sung; after which, the Deputies re-

paired to the Place where they usually meet; It was proposed to proceed to the Choice of a Marshal, but they adjourned without doing any thing; They met again this morning, and are now sitting, not having yet chosen a Person to discharge that Office. The Deputies from several Palatinates are not yet arrived. The Cardinal Primate is expected in 2 or 3 days from *Silesia*, and the Crown-General from *Lemberg*. The King's Regiment of Guards is at present Quartered in this City, and some other Regiments are encamped near this Place, to the number of 4000 Men. A Draught is made out of the *Saxon* Regiments of Horse, in order to form a new Regiment of Horse-Guards. The Sieur *Freyceling*, a Councillor in the Council of State of *Saxony*, came hither last Saturday from *Dresden*, and has had Audience of the King.

Dantzick, June 24. Letters from *Warsaw* of the 19th Instant say, the Diet had not yet chosen their Marshal, and were resolved not to proceed to the Choice of one, until the *Saxon* Forces were marched out of that Kingdom. The Magistrates of this City have set Fines upon several Burghers, who, contrary to their late Order, sold all the Corn they had in their hands, whereas they were required by the said Order to keep a Tenth Part of it by them during a certain time.

Vienna, June 20. There being a great Scarcity of Corn in the *Lower Austria*, this Court has given Orders that they be supplied from *Bohemia*, and the other Hereditary Countries where Corn is more plentiful. The Count *de Berka* is preparing to go from this Place on his Embassy to *Venice*. An Express arrived here this week from *Hungary* with Letters from Count *Marsigli*, by which we have an Account, that the Commissioners for settling the Limits were come to *Karolstadt*, the chief City of *Croatia*, where they had made an end of regulating the Borders of that Province, and that they intended to go from thence in a day or two towards the Frontiers of *Transylvania*, to settle the Limits on that side. We have Letters from *Constantinople* of the 12th of May which give an Account, that the Grand Signior apprehending that the Czar of *Muscovy* is making Preparations to renew the War against him as soon as the Truce of two Years lately concluded between them is expired, he has ordered divers of his Gallies to be sent to the *Black-Sea* under the Command of the Bassa of *Smyrna*, who is directed to visit all the Ports along that Coast which are in his Dominions, and to take care to put those Places in a Condition of Defence. The *Greeks* made great Application to the Port, that the Possession of the Holy Sepulchre at *Jerusalem*, which was given some time ago to the *Roman* Catholics, may be restored to them. The King of *Spain* has given the Order of the *Golden Fleece* to the Earl of *Carlingford*, in consideration of his long and eminent Services to the House of *Austria*.

Hague, July 3. The Letters from *Dieren* give an Account, that the King intends to return from thence to *morrow* to *Lo*. This day his Excellency Sir *Jeseph Williamson*, one of His Majesty's Ambassadors Extraordinary and Plenipotentiaries at the Treaty
