

alterations of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Winchester embodies certain modifications thereof:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Ampport and Monxton are now full the Reverend Alban Edward Russell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ampport and the Reverend John Meredith Cobbett being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Monxton:

" And whereas there is a charge of £190 per annum upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Ampport in respect of a pension to the Reverend John Spencer Mullins Walker, a former Incumbent thereof:

" And whereas since the date of the said Report the Parsonage House of the said Benefice of Ampport has been destroyed by fire and there is in the hands of Queen Anne's Bounty a fund of £4,280 in respect of the insurance money thereof:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cyril, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Ampport and the said Benefice of Monxton shall be permanently united together, and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ampport with Monxton' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said Benefice of Monxton only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Ampport and the then Incumbent of Monxton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Ampport only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Monxton and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Monxton if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Ampport shall have been instituted to Ampport subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Ampport before that date and shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Ampport following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Monxton and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Monxton

shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That if on the union taking effect each of the said benefices has a parsonage house the parsonage house of Ampport shall be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the united benefice but otherwise the parsonage house of Monxton shall be the house of residence until a house more suitably placed for the residence of an Incumbent of the United Benefice has been provided in substitution therefor and that the house at Monxton together with the site and appurtenances and grounds thereof or usually occupied therewith when no longer required as or for such house of residence shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time and in such manner as we shall deem expedient and that the net proceeds of the sale together with the fund of £4,280 and any accumulations of interest thereon held by Queen Anne's Bounty aforesaid or any unexpended balance thereof at that time remaining shall be transferred to the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 4. That (a) upon the union taking effect a part of the total endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say a capital sum of £6,000 being part of a sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefices of Ampport and Monxton pursuant to sections 7 and 38 of the Tithe Act 1936 and the provisions of Part II of the Third Schedule to the said Act, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefices of Ampport and Monxton and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty for the augmentation of the Benefice of Eastleigh in the said Diocese of Winchester, and (b) upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of the said pension to the said John Spencer Mullins Walker, whichever shall the later happen, a further part of the total endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say a capital sum of £6,333 6s. 8d. being a further part of the aforesaid sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated to the said Benefices of Ampport and Monxton shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefices and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty as to £3,166 13s. 4d. part thereof for the augmentation of the Benefice of Knights Enham and as to £3,166 13s. 4d. the remaining part thereof for the augmentation of the Benefice of Baughurst, both in the said Diocese of Winchester:

" 5. That with the consents of the several Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefice of Weyhill and of the said United Benefice of Grateley with Quarley, which consents (save where otherwise specified) are testified by their respectively signing this Scheme, that is to say with the consents of the Provost and Scholars of Queen's College in the University of Oxford (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Collegiate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) as Patrons of the said Benefice of Weyhill, of Ella, Baroness de Paravicini, and the Royal College of Saint Katharine as the alternate Patrons of the said United
