Plymouth, March 23. Lisbonne, Mart. 1. Monfieur de st. Romain the French Ambaflador is now treated upon his High nels account, and is to more ow to be conducted to his Audience, and from thence to the Chappell, where is to be folemnly performed the Bapiline of the young Princels

The t-onde de Prado is preparing for his Embally to the Court of Rome, where he intends to appear with extraordinary Pompand Magnificence. This day was dilpaicht away for Rome a Courier, carrying with him an account of the veccution of those powers which were formerly fent from the Popero five Ecclefiafticks of this place, who have acwording thereunto with fatisfaction examined the proceedings about the Nullity of the former, and the folemnity of the latter Marrisge of the Princels.

Ditto, Mart. 3. Yelterday Monfieur de St. Romain, attended by'a great frain of the Coaches of the Nobility, with those of the Prince and Princess, was conducted in much State by the Marquis de Marialva to his Audience, which was given him by the Prince in a private Room of the Palace, and afterwards by the Queen in another; about four of the clock in the after noon, the Prince and Princels took their feats in the Chappel, where were affembled the Nobility, among it whom the Marquilles de Nigq a and Mariation of the death of the Teremony of the Bip anne of the young Reincels, the one carrying a Grown, and the other a Salt-cel ar; then entred the Ambaliador Mo feur de St. Romain, with the Duke de Gadaval, which last carried the young Princels, followed by the Maids of Honour: the Geremony was performed by the Bishop of Targa, who Bape zed her by the name of Llabella Laufa Jelepais which ended, there followed all fuch publick figns of Joy as she the ufual attendants on the like occasions and in the Evening the Conde de Torre made a Present to the French Ambaliador as from the young Princels, cita Diam maring to the value of 1500 c.

Vienna, Mart. 15. On Sunday laft depasted and the Deputies of the 13 Communalties or United Province of Upper Hungary, upon co fideration of the many others which otherwile might threaten that Kingdom by realist of the late over-bulinels of the Turks in harafnigthe Countrey, and the diffatis action of the people His Imperial Majefty was pleafed to difmils them with much fathfaction, by ondering the refliction of the Temples which had been t kern from them, and giving them fuch a flatisfactory tedeet of their other grievances, as may fufficiently towir ce that and the fire Regiments which were ordered to march towards those parts.

Lyons, Marz. 16. The 3 inftant, the Forces defigned by His most C'ariftian Majesty for the fuccor of Gandia, confisting of eight flour and well disciplin'd Regiments, began to march thorow this City on their way for Thoulons, where the Duke de Beaufort's with all possible expedition ordering the Equipping of the Fleet defigned for meir Transportations; and the 7 and 8 instant marched hence two thousand men which were quartered in the submission thous City, for the fame fervice.

Madrid, Mars. 20, The Cardinal d' Arragentias fo happily quitted himfelfe of his Negotiation with Den Fuan, by his powerful perfuations and his confident affurances of the fincere intentions of the Queen Regent, that at the last he prevailed with him to difmits his Cavalry, and takes the refolution of coming to the Court with a Train onely of his own fervants, and after the reception of his Audience to continue his refidence at the Retiro, from whence he may daily be prefent at fuch Councils as shall be held by the Ministers of State in order to the giving his faid Highness such fatisfaction as he shall reasonably defire : this Evening the Cardinal gave the Queen Regent this ac-count of his laid Negotiation, affuring her that all difficulties were fo wall adjoufted with the Prince, that he would not fail to appear fuddenly at the Court. In order to his fatisfacti n, Don Bernardo Patino the Brother to Fon Fuan's Secretary, who was fecured in the Royal prifon belonging to the Court, was this laft week fet at liberty.

Tis believed that Don Juan after a years continuance in this Court for the fetrlement of his affairs, may according to the Will made by the late King Philip the 4th transport timfelf into the Netherlands with the Time of Governour of those Provinces, with the fame power as was formerly exercised by the Arch-Duke Albert.

Genoua, Mart 20. From Mellina we are informed of the arrival there of the Leopard, an English Fiegar from Stairna on his return home wards. A Vessel lately arrived here from the coast of Battary confirms to us the news that the French Con ul at Tunis was lately killed, with leveral circumstances of the cruelry of the people towards hin, he having been subjected by them to have endeavoured to firre up the Moors against their Gottempent, affuring them for their encouragement that the Beaufort should be fent with a powerful Fleet to uneit-affishance.

From Milan they tell us, that the prefent Governour of that place the Marquis de Balbaces Spinola, has during the late Carneval been diverted by the Nobility and Gentry of that place with Courles at the Ring, Malquerades, and other recreations, performed with much fplendor and gallantry, who sgain entertained them at the Pallace with a Ball and Comedy to their great latisfaction; in the mean time he has had trequent confultations about the most effectual means of easing the people in their T-xes and Paymention and about the end of this 'Moneth has 'appointed a' General Mutter of all the forces within that State.

They are now in expectation of the Duke d' Offona late Vice Roy of Barsellona, who is nominated to fucceed in the Government of the State of Milan, the Marquis de Balbaces Spinols being defigned to be employed from the Court of Spain under the Character of Ambassador to the Emperour.

The Pope having with much carneftnels prefied this Republik to follow the good examples of many Christian Primer in contributing to the affiltance of the Republicit of Menice in the defence of Candia : The Senate is feemingly much inclined to concurre in lo meritorious a with and has ordered Segnior Giovani Luca Durazzo to be the to the Court of Kome as their Refident, there to megonite farther about this and divers other concerniments of this Republick, and hath nominated Segnior Giovani Battiffa de la Rouere to be fent to the Court of France.

Bruffels, Mars. 29. Upon the frequent complaints made to the Conftable of Cafille of the many Robb. ries committed upon the High ways, to the great interrup ion of rade 3 the Conftable has ordered the Duke d' Aerfchos with the Marque de Mauroy to take care for the Valency of paffengers, by lending out fuch parties of Horle as may from time to time cleer the high-ways, and fecure them from fuch future dilorders.

The French continue to make preparations for War, and double the numbers of men are employed about the reparation of their Fortifications in their new Conquefts. They, proteed in the Confifcation of fuch performs who'e Effates are within their Dominions, but the Proprietors cofftinge in the fervice of Spairs.

To morrow are to be fent hence 26 Waggons laden with Pé der March, Bu let, and other Provisions for the Garrifons Walenciennes, Mons Cambray, and Bouchain.

On Saturday laft arrived here a Courier Extraordinary from *Madrid*, and after the delivery of his Letters, palfed hence for *Vienna*, but was not over-forward to give any fu'l account of the affairs of *Spain*.

From Munic in Bavaria we are advited that the Capitulation between that Elector and the Republick of Venice for the furnishing of a thousa d men towards their affiltance in the defence of Gandia, was eve y day expected figned from Venice, by which the faid Elector engages himfelf to entertain 200 men upon his own expences for that fervice, and to defray the charge of 800 more till they fhould arrive upon the Venetian Frontjers; the men are in readinels to march upon the arrival of the Capitulations: the fame Letters inform us, that the differences between the faid Elector and fome of the States of that Countrey are not yet composed.

The Prince Elector of Cologue is said to have put a Garrison into the Cafle of Rochette, to prevent the present posselfor of of his design of selling it to the States of the United Provinces.

Yellenday arrived here Monsieur de Louvigns from Lorrain and Franche Conne. The Prince de Ligny is daily expected here on his return from Spain. Paris, Mart. 30. The Count de st. Paul arrived lately at Marfeilles from his voyage to Candia, and may be expected here to motrow. The Soldiers of His Majefties Guards which were detigned for Candia are countermanded f om the employment, but 'tis believed others will be ordered to fupply their places 3 many Chirurgeons are ordered to prepare quantities of Medicines and sll other necessfaries for wounded men, to be with themfelves transported for Candia, it having been observed that the want of these has occasioned the death of many men which might otherwife have been recovered from their wounds

All perfons who reckon themfelves amongft the Gentry or N bleffe, are ordered to bring in their Names with their Coats of Arms, that they may be Registred in His Majefies Library.

Tis likewife ordered that the Heirs of all Counfellors of Parliament shall for the future after the deceale of the faidy Coupiellors make a formal Regionation of those Charges to which they pretend successfion, to whom shall be paid such studies of Money in lieu of the faid charges as His MajeRy has thought fit to fet upon them, in cafe His MajeRy hall think fit otherwife to dispole of them, that to His Majesty may be ferved with able performand be Masser of His own Bounty; which method is likewife to be observed by all the Courts Soveraign, as also by the Massers of Requests and all other Ufficers of concernment who have the benefit of the Droit annuelle or Paulette.

'i infaid the Swiffes have at last accepted of His Majefics proposals to receive two Crowns apiece for every man which they shall fend into his service.

H gue, April 1. The Heer Copes R fident from h's E'ectoral Highnels of brandenburg, having been fuccesfully cut for othe Stone at Haerlem, used of fome other infigmitics of old age, the 29th paft at Ha rlem: his body is to be conveyed thence to Htrecht, there to be enterred by his Lady.

The Heer Boreel being fomenting in returned hither, has given the States an account of the first fly in the Court of England. The Sieur de Geu is-arrived and the situation of the Sieur de Geu the perfon designed to fucceed the Situa Corffus as Refadent from that Court, but as retonting states of sites.

Yelterday the Portugal Ambaliadorings folemnly conducted by the Barons de Ghent and 2 feren to his Audience, attended by a Train of Forty Coaches, he made his speech in the Portugal Language, in which he affured the States of the friendship and good correspondency which the Prince his Master intended to preferve with this Republick, for the continus. ce wheteof there should be notting wanting on his file, defiring that fome Com<sup>3</sup> milfioners might be appointed to renew the Conferences which were formerly began in the time of the Government of King Alphons.

We had lately inversal confilent reports of the discovery of a confipracy for the furprisal of the Fort of Shin, for which leveral perfons were feiled and committed; but upon a firigit examination it was proved that the faid perfons who were taken as they were curioufly viewing and obferving the morks, had no other defign then the deciding of a wager laid between fome perfons upon the firength and weakaels of the leveral parts of that fortification.
