Genoua, June 16. N. S.

Ignior Girolamo Mari, whom our Senate lately made Choice of to be their Doge, has taken Possession of that Dignity, and thereupon received the usual Compliments. On the roth Instant, the Prince of Monaco, who is going with the Character of Ambassador from the Most Christian King to the Pope, arrived in this Port with 4 French Galleys; He was faluted by the Cannon of this Place, and the Master of the Ceremonies, with several Deputies from the Senate, were fent to Compliment him; The Duke of Twofis also fent him a Compliment by one of his Gentlemen; He Rayed here till the 13th, and then continued his Voyage to Civita-Vecchia. A Squadron of fifteen French Galleys are shortly expected here from Marseilles, defigning to pass along this Coast as far as Meffina; and we hear, another Squadron of 8 French Galleys are ordered to fail towards the Coast of Spain. One of the Galleys belonging to this Republick is fent to Thoulen, to wait for the Arrival of Signior Justiniani, who is returning from England, where he resided with the Character of Envoy Extraor-

dinary from this Republick.

Turin, June 14. The Marquis d'Urfe, Envoy Extraordinary from the Most Christian King to Congratulate the Duke and Durchess of Savoy.on the Birth of the Prince of Piedmont, had Audience of their Royal Highnesses yesterday; The Marquis de Pluvault, who is come hither with the like Commission from the Duke of Orleans, has also had Audience of the Duke and Dutchess. Their Royal Highnesses have likewise received the Compliment of the Prince of Vaudemont by the Count de Porro, who is fince returned to Milan. The Magistrates of this Place, and the Deputies from the Magistrates of Chambery, Nice, and Pignerol, have also paid their Compliments to the Dutchess of Savoy, and made her the usual

Presents on this occasion.

Milan, June 17. The Senate here have made Applications to the Prince of Vaudemont our Governor, that the Suifs Troops now in the King of Spain's Service in this Dutchy may be fent home, and offer to pay the Arrears that are due to them, amounting to above 200000 Crowns; part whereof they will pay as foon as they shall have begun
their March, and the rest afterwards by Monthly
Payments; This Proposal was well received by
his Highers's who has main about it to the his Highmess, who has writ about it to the Court of Spain. Baron Rooft, Envoy from the Emperor to the Suiss Cantons, is come hither from Suisserland to confer with our Governor. The Abbot of Darmstad is arrived here from Spain in his return to Rome. The Count of Berlips is likewise come hister from Madrid, and will be going in few days towards Vienna, where he is to make the King of Spain's Compliment of Congratulation to the King and Queen of the Romans on their Marriage. The Marquis de Parella arrived here last Saturday from Turin, and having paid his Respects to the Prince of Vaudemont, he continued his Journey the next day to Mantua.

Venice, June 20. The Senate having resolved to exclude from their Assembly all the Noblemen, whose Relations enjoy any Offices or Benefices depending on the Pope, or who receive any Pensions, or other Gratifications from the Court of Rome; This Matter was brought before the Great Council at their last Meeting for their Approbation, but after a long Debate, it was rejected by a Majority of Votes. A Merchant Ship is lately come in here, which met off Ragusa the last Convoy that sailed from hence for the Levans. Our Advices from Dalmatia say, the Commisfioners who are met at Sternizza, on the Borders of that Province, to settle the Limits between the Venetian and Turkish Dominions, continue their Conferences with good Success; The Venetian Commissioner, Signior Grimani, has writ a Letter to the Senare, to inform them that he had received one from Count Marsigli, the Emperor's Commissioner for settling the Limits in Hungary, fignifying that the Emperor his Master expects the Republick of Venice should yield to him the Town of Obreazze, situate on the Frontiers of Dalmatia bordering on Greatia, as was stipulated by the Treaty of Alliance between the Emperor and this Republick; upon which the Senate has been extraordinarily assembled, and an Express is sent to Vienna with Instructions to the Venetian Ambassa. dor at that Court touching this Matter.

Warfaw, June 22. The Diet have not yet chosen a new Marshal or Speaker; And in the mean time the Starost of Minsky (who was Marskal of the former Diet) discharges this Office according to Cultom. The King has let them know, that the greatest part of the German Forces are already on their March home, and that he has sent Orders to hasten them; But the Deputies desire that the Regiments, which are now quartered in and near this City, may likewife be fent away, before they proceed to the Choice of a new Marshal; And that the Pasta Conventa may be laid before the Diet. The Cardinal Primate is returned from Silesia to Lowitz, the Place of his usual Residence,

and is expected here in few days.

Vienna, June 24. The Imperial Court is returned hither from Laxembourg. Gardinal Colonitz is come to this Place from Presburgh, and has waited upon the Emperor, to give him an Account of the State of Affairs in Hungary. The Baron of Holtrop, of one of the ancientest Families in Silesia, is made a Count of the Empire. The Baron of Kesselstadt is arrived here with the Character of Envey Extraordinary from the Elector of Triers. Our Advices from Hungary fay, feveral Regiments of the Imperial Troops are marching towards the Frontiers, to be employed in dismantling the Places which

are to be enfloyed in difficulting the Flaces which are to be restored to the Turks.
