**I**N the Session of the Diet on the 24th Instant, they spent all their Time in Debates about choosing a Marshal, and the Diet being still sitting when the Post went away, it occasioned a Report, that they had chosen the Sword-bearer of *Cracow*, who was proposed by the Deputies of *Lesser Poland*, pretending that the last Marshal being a Deputy of *Lithuania*, it's now their Turn to have a Marshal of their Province; But this was opposed by the Deputies of *Greater Poland* and *Lithuania*, the latter alledging, That though the Marshal of the last Diet was chosen out of the Deputies of *Lithuania*, yet they had not lost their Turn, by reason that Diet separated without making any publick Act. And the Thing was so warmly disputed, that they could come to no Conclusion therein. The Diet have met since every day, but have not yet fixed on the Choice of a Marshal; In these Meetings, the Matter about the *German* Forces was again debated, and it was the Opinion of most of the Deputies, That the Regiments now encamped near this City, to the number of about 5000 Men, should march to *Prussia*, to be in a readines to defend that Country in case of a Rupture with the Elector of *Brandenburgh*. A Motion was also made, that the Resident of *Brandenburgh* should be ordered to retire forthwith out of the Kingdom, but no Resolution was taken thereupon. In the mean time the Cardinal Primate and the Crown General are daily expected here. The Deputies from several Palatinates are still absent, and some of them not yet chosen; upon which the King has sent new Circular Letters to those Provinces, Requiring them forthwith to send Deputies to the Diet. The Forces that are ordered to return to *Saxony*, are already arrived on the Borders of *Silesia*, but are obliged to stop there, till some Matters relating to their Passage through that Country are adjusted between the Commissioners appointed by the Emperor and this Crown for regulating the same. Our Letters from *Muscovy* say, the Czar is raising a very numerous Army, and has ordered vast quantities of Provisions and Ammunition to be got together, that a great number of Vessels are building by his Direction, and that the *Muscovites* are repairing and augmenting the Fortifications of *Azof*; Which Preparations are said to be designed against the *Turks*, in case the Truce of Two Years concluded between the Czar and the Grand Signior at *Carlowitz* be not prolonged, or a Peace made.

*Vienna*, July 1. The Count *de Simon li*, arrived here some days ago from Count *Marsigli*, the Imperial Commissioner in *Hungary* for settling the Limits, to give the Emperor an Account of the Progress he has made in the Execution of his Commission, and of the Disputes that are arisen between him and the *Turkish* Commissioners concerning the Restitution of *Novi* and its Dependencies, demanded by the *Turks*, who also claim the Pro-

priety of the River *Unna*, and of an Island in that River near *Jessanoviza*, and he is sent back with the Emperor's further Directions to Count *Marsigli* concerning these Matters. My Lord *Pages*' Secretary, who arrived here some time ago, is returned to *Andrinople*. Upon the Advice this Court have received, that the *Turkish* Ambassador to the Emperor would set out in a short time on his Journey hither, the Count *d'Orting* has received Orders to prepare his Equipage, in order to be going from hence towards the middle of the next Month on his Embassy to the Port; The two Ambassadors are to meet on the Frontier, and then to proceed on their respective Journeys. An Express was sent this week with the Emperor's Orders to Count *Martiniz*, his Ambassador at *Rome*, upon the Dispute that lately happen'd between him and the Cardinal *de Bouillon*, concerning the Precedency at the Entry of the Ambassador of *Tuscany* into that City. It's said, that as soon as this Matter is adjusted, Count *Martiniz* will return hither to enter upon the Office of Captain of the Emperor's Guards which is lately given him, and the Count *de Lamberg* is already appointed to succeed him in his Embassy at *Rome*. The Count of *Zedenisky*, Envoy from the Emperor to the Court of *Poland*, is made one of the Emperor's Council, and he will shortly return to *Warsaw*. It's said, the Count of *Tchermn* will be made Upper Chancellor of *Bohemia*, and Count *Gunsaker* of *Staremberg*, President of the *Aulick* Chamber. They write from *Silesia*, that the Regiments of *Taff*, *Serini*, and *Vauben*, are arrived on the Frontiers of that Province which border on *Poland*, and are encamped between *Jabianca* and *Great Glogaw*, and that General *Hastingen*, who commands the Troops in those Parts, has posted the Garrisons of *Great Glazaw*, *Brick*, and *Namslaw*, near the Fords and Bridges over the River *Baertsch*, and that the Regiment of *Nienbourg* which is quartered in *Silesia*, and some other Regiments from *Bohemia*, *Moravia*, and *Hungary*, are on their March to join these Troops, in order to observe the *Saxon* Forces as they pass through *Silesia* in their return from *Poland* to *Saxony*, and to oblige them to comply with what is stipulated between the Ministers of the Emperor and the King of *Poland* concerning the way they are to take, and the order they are to observe in their March through the Emperor's Dominions.

*Bavaria*, July 14. The 11th Instant being the Elector of *Bavaria*'s Birth-day, his Electoral Highness was complimented on this occasion by the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Quality. The Count *de Bergesick* arrived here the 12th from his House at *Leefdale*, and waited upon the Elector the next day, and he will shortly be going to *Madera*, pursuant to the Order he has received from the King of *Spain*, who has appointed the Count *de St. Pierre* to discharge the Office of Chief Director of his Revenues in the *Netherlands* in his absence.
