N the Session of the Diet on the 24th Instant, they spent all their Time in Debates about choosing a Marshal, and the Diet being still fitting when the Post went away, it occa-fioned a Report, that they had chosen the Swordbearer of Cracow, who was proposed by the Deputies of Ufer Poland, pretending that the last Marshal being a Deputy of Lithuania, it's now their Turn to have a Marshal of their Province; But this was opposed by the Deputies of Greater Poland and Lithusnis, the latter alledging, That though the Mar-shal of the last Diet was chosen our of the Deputies of Lithuania, yet they had not loft their Turn, by reason that Diet separated without making any publick A&. And the Thing was so warmly disputed, that they could come to no Conclusion therein. The Diet have met since every day, but have not yet fixed on the Choice of a Marshal; In these Meetings, the Matter about the German Forces was again debated, and it was the Opinion of most of the Deputies, That the Regiments now encamped near this City, to the number of about 5000 Men, should march to Prussa, to be in a readiness to defend that Country in case of a Ruprure with the Elector of Brandenburgh. A Motion was also made, that the Resident of Brandenburgh should be ordered to retire forthwith out of the Kingdom, but no Refolution was taken thereupon. In the mean time the Cardinal Primate and the Crown General ate daily expected here. The Deputies from several Palatinates are still absent, and some of them not yet chosen; upon which the King has sent new Circular Letters to these Provinces. Circular Letters to those Provinces, Requiring them forthwith to fend Deputies to the Diet. The Forces that are ordered to return to Saxony, are already arrived on the Borders of Silefia, but are obliged to flop there, till some Matters relating to their Passage through that Country are adjusted between the Commissioners appointed by the Emperor and this Crown for regulating the fame. Our Letters from Musicovy fay, the Czar is raifing a very numerous Army, and has ordered vast quantities of Provisions and Ammunition to be got together, that a great number of Vessels are building by his Direction, and that the Museowites are repairing and augmenting the Fortifications of zeef; Which Preparations are said to be designed against the Turks, in case the Truce of Two Years concluded between the Czar and the Grand Signior at Carlowisz be not prolonged, or a Peace made.

Vienna, July 1. The Count de Simon lli, arrived here some days ago from Count Marsigli, the Impenal Commissioner in Hungary for settling the Limits, to give the Emperor an Account of the Progress he has made in the Execution of his Commission, and of the Disputes that are arisen between him and the Turkith Commissioners concerning the Restitution of Novi and its Dependencies, demanded by the Turks, who also claim the Pro-

priety of the River Unna, and of an Illand in that River near Jessanoviza, and he is sent back with the Emperor's further Directions to Counce Marfigli concerning these Matters. My Lord Pager's Secretary, who arrived here some time ago, is returned to Andrinople. Upon the Add vice this Court have received, that the Tarks ish Ambassador to the Emperor would set out in a short time on his Journey hither, the Count d'Oring has received Orders to prepare his Equipage, in order to be going from hence towards the middle of the next Month on his Embassy to the Port; The two Ambassadors are to meet on the Frontier, and then to proceed on their respective Journey's. An Express was sent this week with the Emperor's Orders to Count Martinitz, his Ambassador at Rome, upon the Dispute that lately happen'd between him and the Cardinal ... de Beuillon, concerning the Precedency at the Entry of the Ambañador of Tuscany into that City. It's faid, that as foon as this Matter is adjusted, Count Martinitz will return hither to enter upon the Office of Captain of the Emperor's Guards which is lately given him, and the Count de Lamberg is already appointed to succeed him in his Embassy at Rome. The Count of Zedenisky, Envoy from the Emperor to the Court of Poland, is made one of the Emperor's Council, and he will short y return to Warfaw. It's faid, the Count of Tehernin will be made Upper Chancellor of Bohemia, and Count Ganaker of Staremberg, President of the Aulick Chamber. They write from Silesia, that the Regiments of Tuff, Serini, and Vauben, are arrived on the Frontiers of that Province which border on Poland, and are encamped between Jablunca and Great Glogaw, and that General Haflingen, who commands the Troops in those Parts, has posted the Garrisons of Great Glagaw, Brick, and Namslaw, near the Fords and Bridges over the River Baertsch, and that the Regiment of Niewbourg which is quartered in Silefia, and some other Regiments from Bohemia, Moravia, and Huny, are on their March to join these Troops, in order to observe the Saxon Forces as they pais through Silesia in their return from Poland to Saxony, and to oblige them to comply with what is stipulated between the Ministers of the Empefor and the King of Poland concerning the way they are to take, and the order they are to obferve in their March through the Emperor's Duminions.
