

ving regard to the Province he is of; but none of them have yet met with so General an Approbation; as to put an end to this Dispute. The Cardinal Primate arrived here two days ago from *Lowitz*. A Body of *Saxon* Troops continue encamped near this City.

Vienna, July 14. The Count *Zedenicki*, Envoy from the Emperor to the Crown of *Poland*, is on his departure from hence towards *Warsaw*. The Baron of *Nehm*, Commander of the Garrison of *Pazer Waradin*, arrived here yesterday from *Hungary*. Our Advices from thence say, the Conferences for regulating the Limits are discontinued for some time, the Imperial and *Turkish* Commissioners expecting farther Orders from their respective Masters touching the Difficulties relating to the Possession of *Novi* and its Dependencies, and of two Islands, the one in the *Savi* near *Brod*, and the other in the River *Unna* called *Siffemer*; It's said, that Orders are sent to *Count Marssigli* the Imperial Commissioner, to propose to the *Turks* that the Fortifications in the two Islands above-mentioned may be demolished, and that the Possession of them remain in Common to both Nations, but to insist upon the Restitution of *Novi*, which is of great use for securing the Frontiers on that side. They write from *Silesia*, that the Troops that are to be encamped in that Province are marching towards the Rendezvous assigned them.

Brussels, July 17. The Count *de Bergeick* intends in few days to begin his Journey to *Madrid*. The Conferences at *Lisler* for settling the Limits in the *Spanish Netherlands*, will be renewed in few days. They write from the *French Conquests*, that they are hard at work in fortifying *Furnes*.

Hague, July 11. They write from *Dieren*, that the King came thither last *Tuesday* in the evening from *Loo*, to which Place His Majesty intended to return this day. The States of *Holland* and *Westfriseland* met again this week. The Count *de Tallard*, Ambassador from *France*, is returned to *Utrecht*.

Paris, July 18. N. S. The Court continues at *Marli*. The Count of *Zinzendorf* is daily expected here from *Germany* with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor. The Ambassador from *Venice* has received Advice, that about 4000 of the Emperor's Troops have possessed themselves of a Fort called *Obrizzo*, on the Frontiers of *Dalmatia* and *Croasia*, pretending it belongs to the Emperor.

Plimouth, July 9. His Majesty's Ship the *Pendennis* sailed from hence the 5th Instant to the Eastward, as did likewise His Majesty's Ship the *Solebay* for *Ireland*. On the 6th came in here the *Vine of London*, *Richard Vaughan* Master, bound home with Wine and Brandy from *St. Sebastians*, the *General Commerce of London*, *Vincent Reason* Master, bound home likewise from the same Place, and the *Happy Success of London*, *The Morgan* Master, bound home from *Cadiz*, which Ships sailed again the next day. That day the *Barbary* of this Place, *Pani Bickford* Master, arrived here from *Virginia*; And this day came in here the *Hepwell*, *Robert Hobbs* Master, likewise from *Virginia*.

Bristol, July 10. On the 28th Instant arrived here the *Elizabeth* of this Port, *John Bennet* Master, from *Nevis*; And on the 9th came in the *Baltimore*, *Nicholas Scarburne* Master, from *Virginia*, and the *John of London*, *John Druz* Master, homeward bound from *Riga*. This day came in the *Britannia* of this Port, *Alex. Pinsky* Master, from *Virginia*,

and the *Mary Gailey* of this Place, *Capt. William Raynes* Commander, from *Auzgsa*.
