- (d) Work No. 13.—A line or lines of pipes in the said parish of Otterbourne commencing in the road from Eastleigh to Winchester opposite Rookwood terminating in the said road at a point I chain north-west of the Southern Railway Bridge at Allbrook.
- (2) For the purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said local Act, or of any other local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order in force within the limits within which the Corporation is authorised to supply water as may be necessary or desirable:
