Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 4th day of April, 1941 (C.W. 14784/20) in the words following viz:

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Schedule V, Section VI, to Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, sanction was given, inter alia, to the payment of Command Money and Entertaining Allowance to Captains appointed in command of Shore Establishments:

"And whereas we are of opinion that, in

"And whereas we are of opinion that, in view of the responsibilities and importance of the posts, Commanders or Commanders (A) appointed in command of Royal Naval Air Stations should receive Command Money and Entertaining Allowance:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us to pay Command Money and Entertaining Allowance to those officers at the daily rates of 5s. and 2s 6d. respectively with effect from 10th August, 1939.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Supplementary Scheme bearing date the 3rd day of April, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Supplementary Scheme, under Section II of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, for making certain alterations in the provisions of an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 13th day of April, 1937,

and published in the London Gazette on the 16th day of the same month (hereinafter called the Order of April, 1937), for effecting, inter alia, the union of the Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, with a part of the Benefice of Holliscroft, Saint Luke, and of a further Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 23rd day of November, 1937, and published in the London Gazette on the 26th day of the same month (hereinafter called the Order of November, 1937), for effecting the union of the Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, with the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

"Whereas by the Order of April, 1937, it was directed that upon the unions contemplated by that Order taking effect a part of the endowment of the Benefice of Holliscroft, Saint Luke, being a part, namely £190 per annum, of an annual payment made by us to the Incumbent of such benefice, should be appropriated and paid to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, or of any Benefice or United Benefice of which the Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, should form part, conditionally upon the employment by such Incumbent of a second Assistant Curate at a stipend of not less than £190 per annum:

"And whereas by the Order of November, 1937, it was directed that upon the union of the Benefices of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen. and Sheffield, Saint George, taking effect, provision should be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of not less than two Curates and certain endowments of the United Benefice should be charged with a sum of £30 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of the second of such Curates:

And whereas the union of the Benefices of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, and Sheffield, Saint George, has not yet taken effect but will (in the events which have happened) take effect upon the next vacation of the Benefice of

Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and we are satisfied that the provisions contained in the Schemes affirmed  $\bar{by}$  the Orders of April, 1937, and November, 1937, should be altered as hereinafter recommended and pro-

posed:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, and with the consent also of the Reverend Joseph William Augustus Copeland, being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George (testified by their signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your

Majesty as follows, that is to say:

"I. That in the event of the Reverend Joseph Thomas Hoskins, the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen resigning the said Benefice within a period of six months after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, in order that the union may thereupon take effect, there shall be paid to him by way of compensation the sum of £70 per annum for a period commencing at the date of his resignation as aforesaid and ending at the expiry of six months from the termination of any appointment which he may hold immediately after such resignation as a Chaplain to the

Forces in Your Majesty's Royal Air Force.

"2. That the employment of a second Assistant Curate shall not be a condition of the payment of the sum of £190 per annum referred to in the Order of April, 1937.

"3. That the direction contained in the Order

of November, 1937, for the employment of not less than two Curates shall be rescinded and the Incumbent shall be required to employ such assistance only as is contemplated by Clause 4 hereof.

- 4. That the said sums of £190 per annum and  $f_{30}$  per annum shall be paid (as and when the same shall respectively be or become payable) to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same as follows, that is to say: -
  - (a) Firstly, in paying any compensation to the Reverend Joseph Thomas Hoskins which may be payable to him in accordance with Clause I hereof and, subject thereto;
  - (b) Secondly, in payment towards the cost of the employment by the Incumbent of such whole or part time clerical or lav assistance (other than and in addition to a first Assistant Curate) as the Bishop of the diocese for the time being shall from time to time require."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been ap-

proved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of February, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising the taking down and the sale of the site and materials of the Church of Saint John situate in the Parish of Kempston in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans:

'Whereas the said Church of Saint John is a Chapel of Ease to the Parish Church of the said

Parish of Kempston:

"And whereas a Fund now producing an annual income of £69 or thereabouts is held by certain Trustees upon trust to provide for the payment or part payment of a clergyman to serve or assist in serving the said Church of Saint John and any District attached thereto:

" And whereas a new Church has been provided to serve that portion of the said Parish hitherto served by the said Church of Saint John and such new Church has been consecrated and is known as the Church of The Transfiguration, Kempston:

And whereas the said Church of Saint John is no longer required for the purposes of Divine

Service:
"And whereas the said Benefice of Kempston is now full the Reverend Canon Thomas Henry Woods Barker being the present Incumbent

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, and of the said Thomas Henry Woods Barker (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to

(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Church of Saint John shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners towards the cost of the provision of the said new Church of The Trans-

figuration, Kempston.

"(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint John shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the said new Church of The Transfiguration or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Saint Albans and the bells, organ, and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint John or such of them as the Bishop of Saint Albans shall select, shall be removed to the same new Church, to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Saint Albans which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint John as aforesaid.

" (d) That the Fund held by certain Trustees as aforesaid shall be held by them upon trust to apply the income thereof for the payment or part payment of a clergyman to serve or assist in serving the said new Church of The Transfiguration and any District attached thereto.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the said Church of Saint John shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the

said Measures are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

## ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:

## Distinguished Service Order.

Acting Squadron Leader John Cunningham (90216), D.F.C., Auxiliary Air Force, No.

604 Squadron.

This officer has continued to display the highest devotion to duty in night fighting One night in April, 1941, he destroyed two enemy bombers during a single patrol and a week later destroyed three enemy raiders during three different patrols. Squadron Leader Cunningham has now destroyed at least ten enemy aircraft and damaged a number of others. His courage and skill are an inspiration to all.

## Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader John Percy Devaynes GETHIN (33188), No. 203 Squadron.

This officer carried out low-flying machine gun attacks against two enemy aerodromes, over 350 miles from his base, and was responsible for the destruction of five enemy aircraft and a petrol lorry. In his attack on the second aerodrome he destroyed four aircraft, all of which caught fire. Squadron Leader Gethin has completed many operational missions. He has displayed considerable skill and great tenacity in delivering his attacks.

Flight Lieutenant Geoffrey David Leybourne HAYSOM (39736), No. 79 Squadron. This officer has been engaged on opera-

tional flying since the war began. He has displayed great keenness in his efforts to seek and engage the enemy and has destroyed at least five of their aircraft.

Flight Lieutenant Eric Thornton SMITH (80056), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 237

(Rhodesian) Squadron.

This officer has been continuously engaged on operations over a long period. As commander of a detached flight he has displayed considerable tactical resource and efficiency. He has himself participated in 67 operational missions and has at all times displayed outstanding courage and leadership with a strong determination to seek and harrass any target allotted him.

Captain Kenneth Weekes Driver (102646), No. I Squadron, South African Air Force.

This officer has led his flight on many offensive operations and fighter patrols. On one occasion, he became separated from his flight during an engagement and, on leaving the area, he observed four enemy fighters and immediately engaged them, shooting one down in flames. Two of the enemy aircraft then attacked him and so severely damaged his aircraft that he was unable to maintain

superior speed. By skilful manœuvring, although he was attacked continuously for 15 minutes, he succeeded in evading them and flew his damaged aircraft back to an advanced landing ground and landed safely. He has displayed great courage in his attacks against the enemy and has destroyed ten of their aircraft in aerial combat and at least five on the ground.

Flying Officer Peter Damien Court Thomas (41081), No. 223 Squadron.

This officer has been continuously employed as an operational pilot since the outbreak of war with Italy and has completed some 40 operational flights with marked success. On a recent night patrol he attacked an ammunition train by dive-bombing and when this had proved unsuccessful, he continued the attacked with incendiary ammunition eventually setting the train on fire and destroying it. His night raids have been outstanding. He has frequently remained over his target for an hour at a time, dropping his bombs singly and then attacking the ground defences with machine gun fire. Flying Officer Thomas has proved himself to be a daring pilot and has always pressed home his attacks with the greatest determina-

Lieutenant Robin PARE (202945), No. 1 Squadron, South African Air Force.

In February, 1941, Lieutenant Pare was detailed with six other aircraft to carry out an attack on the aerodrome at Massawa. On approaching the target, he observed an anti-aircraft gun post about to open fire on Ĥe attacked the leader of the formation. and silenced this post but in doing so his guns jammed. In spite of this he continued to dive down on other anti-aircraft posts thus minimising the fire directed against the rest of his formation. Lieutenant Pare also displayed great courage and determination in the battle of Keren, shooting down four enemy fighters in two air battles within three days.

Pilot Officer Arthur Norman William Johnstone

(42313).

This officer has been continuously engaged during on operations over a long period, during which he has completed many sorties. On one occasion he observed an enemy bomber Unable to destroy it by on the ground. machine-gun fire, he flew past the aircraft, very low, and succeeded in hitting it with a verey signal cartridge, which set the aircraft on fire. In February, 1941, he made a reconnaissance over the Agordat area returning with valuable information which enabled land forces to enter the town the following morning. This officer has at all times displayed great enthusiasm, determination initiative.

Pilot Officer Walter Sinclair Kennedy (84999), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 47

Squadron.

One day in March, 1941, this officer was the pilot of an aircraft engaged on a bombing attack on a selected target in the Cheren area. At the conclusion of his run over the target he was attacked by two enemy fighters. Incendiary bullets caused petrol from the port main tank to catch fire. gunner was severely wounded he refused to

abandon aircraft and succeeded in extinguishing the flames, although a portion of the fittings of the main tank remained smouldering throughout the remainder of the flight. In order to obtain immediate medical assistance for his wounded air gunner, Pilot Officer Kennedy did not attempt to alight at an advanced landing ground but returned to base where he successfully accomplished a difficult landing.
