At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 25th day of April, 1941.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 4th day of April, 1941 (C.W. 14784/

39), in the words following, viz.:—
"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in

"And whereas by Schedule V, Section VI, to Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, sanction was given, inter alia, to the payment of Command Money and Entertaining Allowance to Captains appointed in command of Shore Establishments:

"And whereas we are of opinion that, in

view of the responsibilities and importance of the posts, Commanders or Commanders (A) appointed in command of Royal Naval Air Stations should receive Command Money and Entertaining Allowance:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us to pay Command Money and Entertaining Allowance to those officers at the daily rates of 5s. and 2s 6d. respectively with effect from 10th August, 1939.

Lords Commissioners The Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
