

has been to wait upon the King, and 'tis said he will be sent thither again in a short time.

Vienna, July 11. This Court being resolved to put their Frontier Places in Hungary into a good condition of Defence, Orders are given to that effect, and divers Engineers and other Officers are sent from hence to view the Fortifications of those Places, and give Directions for such Additions to be made to them as shall be found necessary; And our Letters from *Peterwaradin* say, the new Fortifications of that Place are already begun, and carried on with great diligence by the Imperial Forces, who are employed in that Work. These Advices add, that the *German Prisoners of War* are brought to *Belgrade* to be exchanged pursuant to the Treaty of Peace, among whom are divers Officers that were thought to have been killed in the Engagements during the War. Count *Osting*, the Emperor's Ambassador to the Port, intends in a short time to begin his Journey to *Constantinople*. Our Letters from *Croatia* say, the Imperial and *Turkish* Commissioners for settling the Limits, were still expecting the Orders from their respective Masters, touching the Disputes about the Possession of *Novi*, and some other Places on the Borders of that Province, and designed in the mean time to go and regulate the Boundaries of *Transylvania*.

Francfort, July 19. The Protestants that are banished out of the Duke of *Saxony's* Territories on account of their Religion, pass daily by this Place in great Numbers from *Switzerland*, to settle themselves in the Countries belonging to the Elector of *Brandenbourg*, and other *German* Princes, who are pleased to entertain them in their Dominions. 'Tis yet uncertain when the Town of *Brisac* will be evacuated.

Brussels, July 24. The Prince of *Parma* came to this place from *France* on Monday last, and intends to continue here some time. Abbot *Steffany* Envoy from the Elector of *Hanover*, is returned hither from *Cologne*. It's said, the Conference at *Lisse*, for regulating the Limits between the Territories of *France* and *Spain* in the *Netherlands*, will be renewed in a few days. We have Advice from *Lige*, that a Placet has been published there, to forbid the Importation of the Manufactures of these Provinces.

Loe, July 24. The Baron de *Chassignat*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Bishop of *Osnabrug*, came hither some days ago to Complement His Majesty upon his Arrival in these Parts, and to notify his Matters Promotion to that Bishoprick. The Count *d'Arversberg*, Envoy from the Emperor, arrived here last Wednesday from the *Hague*. The Earl of *Portland* came hither the same day, and yesterday in the afternoon his Lordship went to *Nieuwenhys*, about 5 Leagues from hence.

Hague, July 24. N. S. The Ambassador of *Sweden* had a Conference yesterday with the Deputies of the States-General. Count *Déon*, Envoy from the Elector of *Brandenbourg*, designs shortly to return to *Loe*. Monsieur *Galeski*, Ambassadors from *Poland*, having received Orders from the King his Master to return home, he designs accordingly to be going from hence in 2 or 3 days for *Brussels*, intending to pass through *Germany*.

Plimouth, July 16. His Majesty's Ship the *Caroline* sail'd from hence on the 12th Instant to the Eastward, as did also the *Bernard* of *Amsterdam*, *Small Sagar* Master, bound home from the *Canaries*; the same day came in here his Majesty's Ship the *Edward* from cruising, and the *Reformation* of *London*, *John Combridge* Master, bound to *Oporto*. His Majesty's Ships the *Loe* and *Swan* sail'd from this

Place on the 14th for *Ireland*. Yesterday arriv'd here the *George*, *Richard Dowling* Master; and the *Palm-Tree*, *Tho. Couch* Master; and this day the *Rogers*, *John Samderson* Master, and the *Rose*, *William Welchman* Master; all four from *Virginia*.
