2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 12th May, 1941, to Saturday, the 17th May, 1941, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932.
SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

(CLIFFORD GORDON GORDON-WILSON).

Whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and by Regulation 5 of the Raw Opium etc. Regulations, 1937, the Authorities granted by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the Raw Opium etc. Regulations, 1937, to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which these Regulations apply, were by Notice published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 29th March, 1940, withdrawn from Clifford Gordon Gordon-Wilson, M.R.C.S. Eng., M.R.C.P. Lond., whose registered address was 86, Queen's Gate, London, S.W.7, who had been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas at the same time a direction was given by the Secretary of State that it should not be lawful for the said Clifford Gordon Gordon-Wilson to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937:

Now, therefore, I hereby suspend, until further Order, the operation of the said Notice of Withdrawal and of the said direction regarding prescriptions.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932.
SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF
AUTHORISATIONS.

(HENRY SCOTT BUCKLAND.)

Whereas in pursuance of the power conferred upon the Secretary of State by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, the Authorisations granted by the aforesaid Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian
