Warsaw, July 13. N.S.

ON the 11th Instant the Deputies of the Diet with their new Marshal waited on the King, (who was seated under a Canopy of State in the Room where the Senate usually meet) and kissed His Majesty's Hand; The Marshal of the Diet on this occasion assured him of their Fidelity, and Resolution, to bring this Meeting to a good Conclusion, and the King declared to them, That he will send all his German Forces out of the Kingdom within a fortnight after the Diet is ended. The Envoy of Moscow has taken his Leave of the King, and is gone from hence on his return home. The Crown-Marshal is expected here this day from Lemberg.

Peter-Waradin, July 9. The Imperial and Turkish Commissioners, who are met on these Frontiers to settle the Limits between the German and Turkish Territories, are still expecting the return of the Courriers they have sent to their respective Masters, for their further Orders concerning the Possession of the Town of Novi, situate on the River Unna, and its Dependencies, which both sides lay claim to; But in the mean time they continue their Conferences, to adjust Matters concerning several other Places of less Note that are in dispute between them. A Body of the Emperor's Forces are employed in working on the new Fortifications of this Place, in which they have already made a considerable Progress, and two other Bodies are encamped near Esbeck and Arat for the same purpose. A great number of Turkish Prisoners of War are brought to this Place and the neighbouring Towns from several Parts of the Empire, in order to be exchanged with the Christian Prisoners that are at Belgrade. Divers Turks are come into these Parts on account of Trade; and a good Correspondence and free Intercourse is now established between the Germans and the Subjects of the Ottoman Empire.

Vienna, July 15. The Imperial Court continues in the Palace of Favorita, but (it's said) will shortly remove to Newstadt, to take the Diversion of Hunting, and from thence will go to Ebersdorf. The Count de Berleps is arrived here from Madrid, to make the King of Spain's Compliments of Congratulation upon the Marriage of the King of the Romans. The Baron of Schonborn, Brother to the Elector of Mentz, is arrived here in the Quality of Envoy Extraordinary from his Electoral Highness, and it's said, his Business is

about settling the Garrisons of the Frontier Places on the Rhine. The Count de Zedelinsky, Envoy from this Court to the King of Poland, is on his departure from hence towards Warsaw, and it's said he will have the Character of Plenipotentiary from the Emperor at the Treaty to be set on foot for accommodating the Differences between that Crown and the Elector of Brandenburg in relation to the Affair of Elbing. Count Philip of Sinzendorf went from this Place three days ago with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor to the Most Christian King. A Courier was sent from hence this week to Turkey, to acquaint the Ministers of that Court when Count Otting, the Emperor's Ambassador to the Grand Signior, intends to begin his Journey thither, that the Turkish Ambassador to the Emperor may take his Measures accordingly, it being agreed that both Ambassadors shall meet on the Frontiers, and proceed from thence at the same time on their respective Journeys. There is a Dispute arisen between the Emperor and the Republick of Venice about the County of Licca, on the Borders of Croatia; The Imperialists took it from the Turks during the late War, but having occasion for their Troops elsewhere, left this Country unguarded, and the Venetians thinking they had abandoned it, possessed themselves of it, and have kept it in their hands these seven years; The Imperialists lately retook the Castle that is there, and put into it a Garrison of 50 Men, of which the Republick has complained by their Minister here, and demands that the same be restored to them, offering afterwards to examine fairly the Emperor's Pretensions and Right thereunto; On the other hand, the Imperialists seem unwilling to quit their Possession, but have however made Overtures to accommodate the Matter, and to yield this Country to the Venetians for a Sum of Money. The Emperor's Ministers seem to be very intent upon fortifying the frontier Places in Hungary, and divers Workmen with great Quantities of proper Instruments, and necessary Materials for this purpose, are daily sent from hence by Water to Hungary.

Francfort, July 21. The Count of Dietrichstein, who is appointed by the Emperor to go with the Character of his Envoy Extraordinary to the Ele-

Elect

Elect of *Bavaria*, arrived here yesterday from *Vienna*, and this morning continued his Journey towards *Brussels*. The Landgrave of *Hesse-Cassel* intends to leave *Swalbach* to-morrow and to return to *Cassel*, the Place of his usual Residence. They write from *Ratisbonne*, that the Bishop of *Passau*, whom the Emperor has appointed to be his Chief Commissioner at the Imperial Diet, is not yet arrived there from *Passau*, there being some Dispute touching the manner of his Reception in that Assembly, which he desires may be adjusted before he repair thither. The French have not yet fixed on any time for the evacuating of *Brisac*. They continue to work with great application on the Fortifications of *Landau*.

Loc, July 28. Count *d'Aversberg*, the Emperor's Envoy, who came hither in the beginning of the last week from the *Hague*, returned thither on *Saturday*. The Count *de Tallard*, Ambassador from *France*, waited on His Majesty last *Sunday*, and went back to *Utrecht* the same evening. His Majesty intends to lie at *Dieren* this night, and to go from thence on *Saturday* to *Breda* and *Bergen-opzoom* to view those Garrisons, and the *Tuesday* following His Majesty intends to lie at *Zulstien* in his return hither.

Hague, July 28. The *Sieur Galesky*, Ambassador from the King of *Poland*, left this Place on *Sunday* last in order to his return home, and takes his way by *Flanders* and *Germany*. The *Sieur Tholodanus*, Envoy from the King of *Morocco*, had a Conference yesterday with the Deputies of the States-General. The States of *Holland* and *West-Friseland*, will continue their Sessions till the latter end of this week, about which time it's expected; that the Commissioners, whom they have sent to let out to Farm the several publick Revenues belonging to this Province, will return hither to give an Account of their Proceedings. They write from *Lewarden*, that the young Prince of *Nassau*, Stadtholder of *Friseland*, would shortly go from thence to wait upon the King at *Loe*.

Paris, July 29. N S. The King goes to-morrow to *Trianon*, from whence he intends to return next *Saturday* to *Versailles*. The Marquis *de Ferraro*, Ambassador Extraordinary from the Duke of *Savoy*, set out from hence this morning on his return to *Turin*. The Marquis *de Mirepoix*, First Ensign of the Second Company of the King's Guards of *Musquetiers*, and Governor of the County of *Foix*, died on *Sunday* last. *Monsieur d'Aberville* is preparing to make another Voyage to the *West-Indies*; And two of the King's Ships are fitting out at *Rochelle* for this Service. The Merchants here complain, that Money grows very scarce, so that those who take any up at Interest are forced to give 10 or 11 per Cent. whereas they used formerly to have it for 5 or 6.

Portsmouth, July 18. The Squadron of His Majesty's Ships, commanded by Rear-Admiral *Habington*, sailed by this Port yesterday going to the Westward.

Portsmouth, July 20. The *Post-boy* and the *Diligence* Brigantines sailed last *Tuesday* from *Spithead*; His Majesty's Ship the *Bridgewater* came to *Spithead* the same day, but sailed again yesterday to the Westward. His Majesty's Ship the *Penzance* sailed from hence this morning for the *Downes*.

Deal, July 21. His Majesty's Ship the *Carlisle*

came in here the 19th Instant from the Westward. His Majesty's Ships the *Orford*, the *Biddeford*, and the *Margate*, came down from the River yesterday; and the *Tarvisstock*, Capt. *Jones* Commander, arrived here from the *East-Indies*.
