Warsaw, July 13. N.S.

ON the 11th Instant the Deputies of the Diet with their new Marshal waited on the King, (who was seated under a Canopy of State in the Room where the Senate usually meet) and kissed His Majesty's Hand; The Marshal of the Diet on this occasion assured him of their Fidelity, and Resolution, to bring this Meeting to a good Conclusion, and the King declared to them, That he will send all his German Forces out of the Kingdom within a fortnight after the Diet is ended. The Envoy of Moscow has taken his Leave of the King, and is gone from hence on his return home. The Crown-Marshal is expected here this day from Lemberg.

Peter-Waradin, July 9. The Imperial and Turkish Commissioners, who are met on these Frontiers to settle the Limits between the German and Turkish Territories, are still expecting the return of the Courriers they have sent to their respective Masters, for their further Orders concerning the Possession of the Town of Novi, situate on the River Unna, and its Dependencies, which both sides lay claim to; But in the mean time they continue their Conferences, to adjust Matters concerning several other Places of less Note that are in dispute between them. A Body of the Emperor's Forces are employed in working on the new Fortifications of this Place, in which they have already made a considerable Progress, and two other Bodies are encamped near *Esseck* and *Aras* for the same purpose. A great number of Turkish Prisoners of War are brought to this Place and the neighbouring Towns from several Parts of the Empire, in order to be exchanged with the Christian Prisoners that are at *Belgrade*. Divers Turks are come into these Parts on account of Trade; and a good Correspondence and free Intercourse is now established between the Germans and the Subjects of the Ottoman Empire.

Vienna, July 15. The Imperial Court continues in the Palace of *Favorita*, but (it's said) will shortly remove to *Newstadt*, to take the Diversion of Hunting, and from thence will go to *Ebersdorf*. The Count *de Berleps* is arrived here from *Madrid*, to make the King of Spain's Compliments of Congratulation upon the Marriage of the King of the Romans. The Baron of *Schonborn*, Brother to the Elector of *Mentz*, is arrived here in the Quality of Envoy Extraordinary from his Electoral Highness, and it's said, his Business is

about settling the Garrisons of the Frontier Places on the *Rhine*. The Count *de Zedelinsky*, Envoy from this Court to the King of Poland, is on his departure from hence towards *Warsaw*, and it's said he will have the Character of Plenipotentiary from the Emperor at the Treaty to be set on foot for accommodating the Differences between that Crown and the Elector of *Brandenburgh* in relation to the Affair of *Elbing*. Count *Philip* of *Sinzendorf* went from this Place three days ago with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor to the Most Christian King. A Courier was sent from hence this week to *Turkey*, to acquaint the Ministers of that Court when Count *Ottling*, the Emperor's Ambassador to the Grand Signior, intends to begin his Journey thither, that the Turkish Ambassador to the Emperor may take his Measures accordingly, it being agreed that both Ambassadors shall meet on the Frontiers, and proceed from thence at the same time on their respective Journeys. There is a Dispute arisen between the Emperor and the Republick of *Venice* about the County of *Licca*, on the Borders of *Croatia*; The Imperialists took it from the Turks during the late War, but having occasion for their Troops elsewhere, left this Country unguarded, and the Venetians thinking they had abandoned it, possessed themselves of it, and have kept it in their hands these seven years; The Imperialists lately retook the Castle that is there, and put into it a Garrison of 50 Men, of which the Republick has complained by their Minister here, and demands that the same be restored to them, offering afterwards to examine fairly the Emperor's Pretensions and Right thereunto; On the other hand, the Imperialists seem unwilling to quit their Possession, but have however made Overtures to accommodate the Matter, and to yield this Country to the Venetians for a Sum of Money. The Emperor's Ministers seem to be very intent upon fortifying the frontier Places in *Hungary*, and divers Workmen with great Quantities of proper Instruments, and necessary Materials for this purpose, are daily sent from hence by Water to *Hungary*.
