HE Pope has been indisposed for several days, but is well again; And notice has been given to the Foreign Ministers, that he intends to go publickly to Chapel to morrow, on which day he enters into the 9th year of his Pontificate. The Congregation who were appointed to examine the Duke of Savoy's Pretenfions to the Prelentation of the vacant Abbeys in Piedment, have not yet given their Opinion in this Affair; And the Pope, that this may be looked upon by that Prince as a matter of Favour, has himself ordered a Bull to be drawn up, to grant to him this Right of Presentation. The Pope has appointed a Congregation of Cardinals to examine and fettle the Ceremonial of the Entries and Audiences of Ambassadors, and other publick Solemnities, to avoid for the future all Disputes about Precedency between those who affilt therest. The Ambassadors of France and Vinice continue incognito, and it's believed they will not appear in Publick before these Regulations are made. Cardinal Giudici had Audience this week of the Pope, after which he went hence for Naples, to confer with the Viceroy of that Kingdom about the Affairs of the Crown of Spain. Count Martializ, the Emperor's Ambas? sador, has not yet been able to obtain an Audience of the Pope; nor has he yet fixed any time for his departure, thô 'tis fome time fince he received Orders to return home. 'Tis difhe received Orders to return home. 'Tis dif-courfed, that the Queen-Dowager of Poland intends in a short time to retire into a Nunnery. Signior Spinola is come hither from Givita-Vecchia, having delivered up the Government of that Place to his Successor Signior Foscary, and he has waited upon the Pope, to give him an Account of the Condi tion in which he left that Place, and of the Improvements that have lately been made in the Port

Legherne, July 13. By Letters from Meffina of the 29th of the last Month we have an Account, that the Squadron of English Men of War, commanded by Admiral Aslmer, arrived there the 23d from Tripoli, and would make no ftay in that Port, intending, as foon as they had got fome necessary Provisions on board, to continue their Voyage to this Place. The Jacob, Captain John Smith Commander, sailed from hence this week for Meffina and Venice; as did likewise the Shrewsbury, Capt. John Goddard Commander, for Tunis.

Vemze, July 18. A Chiaoux with an Interpreter atrived here last Saturday from Constantinople, with Passes for Signior Soranza, Ambassador Extraordinary from this Republick to the Grand Signior, and they will attend his Excellen-cy in his Voyage to Turkey, which he in-tends to begin on the 10th of the next Month. Signior Mihieli, who has formerly had the Cha-

of Vicina and France, defigns also to go with his Excellency, being chosen to reside at the Port as Ambassador in Ordinary from this Republick. The Senate have begun to put in execution, the Orders that were lately made against those who have any Relations in Church Preferments depending on the Pope; and one of the Secretaries of the College was this week removed from his Office, because the Pope has made his Son one of the Canons at Padna; The Families of Delsini and Prinli, who possed deconsiderable Employments in the Republick, have also been deprived of them for the same reason. The Senate had this week under Consideration the Posture of Affairs in the Morea, and have refolved to keep constantly a good number of Forces in that Province. Our last Letters from Dalmaria say, the Venetian and Turkish Commissioners, who are met on those Frontiers to settle the Limits, continue their Confe-

rences with good Succeis. Warfaw, July 16. The King of Poland having declared, that he will fend all his German Forces out of the Kingdom, except fome Regiments of Horse and Foot which he thinks necessary to keep here for a Guard to attend his Person; The Diet appear fatisfied therewith, and they are drawing up an Act for the Security of the King's Person, and for maintaining the Peace and Quiet of the Kingdom. They have also had under Consideration the Alternative disputed between the Provinces of the Greater and Lesser Poland and Lithusnia, concerning the Choice of a Marshal, and have agreed, That seeing the Marshal of the present Diet is one of the Deputies of the Greater Poland, in the next Diet the Marshal shall be chosen out of the Deputies of Lesser Poland, and that the Marshal of the following Diet (which is to be held at Grodno) shall be of the Province of Lithuania; And it's believed fome farther Regulations rouching this Matter will be made during this Session, to prevent all further Disputes of this nature for the future. The Diet being informed, that the Deputy of the City of Thorne has kept a Correspondence with some Forreign Powers, to the Prejudice of the Republick, they have obliged him to quit the Affembly. Divers Quarrels having lately happened here, in which several Persons have been killed, an Order has been published for severely punishing all Perfons who shall be found offending in this kind. The Princes Alexander and Constantine, Sons to the late King of Poland, are arrived here from Rusland.

Vienna, July 18.
