

Count of Wallenstein is on his departure from hence for Portugal. The Emperor's Ministers have had several Conferences with the Venetian Ambassador concerning the County of Licca on the Frontiers of Croatia, which the Imperialists lately possessed themselves of, as has been already mentioned; And 'tis not doubted but this Matter will be speedily accommodated. The Festival of St. Mary Magdalen, whose Name the Emperor bears, was celebrated this day with great Solemnity; and the Court were on this occasion entertained at *Favorita* with a Ball, a Comedy, and other Diversions.

Cologne, July 31. The Count of Saxe-Zweiburg, Envoy extraordinary from the Emperor to the most Christian King, arrived here last Monday from Vienna, and went the next day to Hambach near Juliers, to confer with the Elector Palatine; after which he continued his Journey to Paris, by the way of Brussels. His Electoral Highness intends on the 6th of the next month to go from Hambach to Heidelberg, and intends to lodge in the Castle of that City, which has been repaired since the Conclusion of the Peace.

Zulesteyn, August 4. The King left *Dieren* last Saturday, early in the morning, being attended by divers Persons of Quality, and arrived the same night at *Breda*, from whence His Majesty went on Monday to *Bergenszoom*, and having dined there with the Governor the Count de *Noyelles*, and viewed the Fortifications of that place, returned at night to *Breda*, and came hither this evening. And to morrow His Majesty intends to go to *Dieren*.

Hague, August 4. The Prince of Hesse-Cassel came to this place on Sunday last from *Dieren*. The States of *Holland* and *Westfriseland* are adjourned till September next. A Placaet was published this week by order of the States-General, to prevent divers Abuses in the baking of Bricks and Tiles; and another is now under the Press, to permit the Exporting of Hops, which has for some time been prohibited.

Paris, August 5. N. S. The Court went this day to *Mari*, where the King intends to stay till Saturday next. Prince *Fah-ni*, to whom the King has lately given the Order of the *Holy-Ghost*, is gone from hence on his Return to *Rome*. On Saturday last the Duke de *Maine* took the usual Oath in the Chamber of Accounts for the Office of Great Master of the Artillery, which Office he has enjoyed several years, but could not be sworn into it before this time, by reason of his not being of Age. The King has presented the Duke and Dutchess of *Orleans* with a Hundred thousand Livres, to defray the Expences of their Journey to visit the Dutchess of *Lorraine* their Daughter, who intends to lye in at *Barr*. The King has ordered Two Millions of Livres to be paid out of his Treasury for building several Docks and Yards at *Port-Louis*. They write from *Thoulon*, that Monsieur *Ferriolles*, Ambassador from this Court to the Port, arrived there the 26th of the last Month, in order to Embark for *Constantinople*.

Dutch, July 27. Divers Merchant Ships bound home from the *West-Indies*, arrived yesterday in the *Dunes*, and among them, one from *Nevis*, which met the Squadron of His Majesty's Ships, Commanded by Rear Admiral *Hobson*, Cruizing in the *Sounding*.

A General Court of the Adventurers of the Royal African Company of England, is appointed to be held on Tuesday next the First of August, at the African-house in *Leadenhall-street*, at 3 in the afternoon.
