N the 22d Instant came into this Port the Dover Frigat, Capt. Cross Commander, being one of the Ships of the Squadron commanded by Admiral Arliner, who gives an Account, That the faid Squadron having been at Algiers, Tunis, and Tripoli, and been received by these Governments with great Kindness and Respect, they arrived the 29th of June at Messima, and on the 6th Instant put to Sea again; The night following the Dover loft Company with them, and made the best of her way hither; so that we hourly expect the Arrival of Admiral Aylmer with the rest of his Squadron. The Ruby, Capt. Alexander Kenton Commander, arrived here this day from London.

Venive, July 20. The Law which was lately made, for excluding those Noblemen from the Senate whose Relations have any Benefices de-pending on the Pope, and for rendring them uncapable of any Publick Employment, not affecting the Secretaries of the Senate, and some other Persons who enjoy considerable Offices under the Republick, and are always chosen from among the Citizens; Another Law has been made, by which these Officers who have any Relations in Church Preferments, are obliged forthwith to quit their Places, or their Relations to refign their Benefices. The Chevalier Soranza, who is chosen to be Ambassador from this Republick to the Port, intends to begin his Voyage thither about the middle of the next Month; and Signior Francisco Michieli, who is appointed to refide there as Ambassador in Ordinary, defigns to accompany him. Our last Advices from Dalmatia give an Account, that there had been a Dispute between the Venetian and Turkish Commissioners for settling the Limits, concerning a certain Tract of Land inhabited by the Morlaques, which the Turks pretend to be within the Grand Signior's Territories, and the Venetians claim as belonging to them; fo that the Commissioners not being able to adjust this Marter, they agreed to fend to their respective Masters for further Orders, and in the mean time to go on with regulating the other Limits, which was done accordingly. These Letters add, that upon the Imperialists possessing themselves of the County of Licca, Signior Mocenigo had sent a good Body of Vinetian Troops to-wards that Frontier, and was himself gone to Zebenico, in order ro oppose them in case they made any other Attempt, but the Imperialifts did not feem to have any farther Design. Our Letters from Coustantinople of the 7th of the last Month give an Account, that the Grand Signior was shortly expected there with his whole Court !
