Warfam, July 24. The Diet continue to meet every day, and proceed with fuch Temper, as gives reason to hope for a good Conclusion of this Meeting. An Account has been laid before them of the Arrears due to the Forces of the Crown, which amount to a very great Sum. They are confidering likewise of the Arrears due to the Army of Lithuama, and of the Demand that has been made by the Great General of that Durchy, that the M ney which he has advanced for the Subliftence of these Forces may be repaid him. It was moved fome days ago in the Diet, That there being divers weighty Affairs before them which cannot possibly be difpatched in the fix weeks during which the Diet is to fit according to the Conflictution of this Kingdom and no longer, this Term might be pro-longed, but it was rejected. As to the Affair of Elbing, it's left wholly to the Senare, who meet every day to consider thereof, and seem very much enclined to accommodate this Difference with the Elector of Brandenburgh, provided the same can be done upon reasonable Terms, and in such a manner as is confishent with the Honour of this Crown. The Bishop of Raab has resigned his Office of Great Chancellor of Poland. General Steyman is made Marshal de-Camp General of all the King's German Forces. The Marquis de la Forest is daily expected here from Germany, where he has by the king's Orders raised a Company of Gentlemen who have been all Officers, and are to attend near the King's Person as his Guards, and a sufficient Pay will be allowed, to enable them to keep a Servant and two Horses each. It continues to be faid, that the King intends, as foon as the Diet is ended, to go to Saxony, and 'tis believed that when he returns, the Queen will come with him.
