**T**HE Prince of *Vaudemont*, our Governor, returned hither last week from *Cosmo*, whither he went to meet the Duke of *Savoy* as he passed through that Place in his way to *St. Maurice*. Mr *Hill*, Envoy Extraordinary from His Majesty of *Great-Britain* to the Duke of *Savoy*, arrived at *Turin* the 22d Instant; but his Royal Highness not being there, Mr *Hill* came hither to wait upon the Prince of *Vaudemont*, by whom he was received with extraordinary Marks of Kindness and Esteem, and he intends in few days to return to *Turin*. An Order has been published here, Requiring all Military Officers to repair to their respective Regiments before the 8th of the next Month, when there will be a General Review of the Troops in the Service of this State.

*Warsaw*, July 24. The Diet continue to meet every day, and proceed with such Temper, as gives reason to hope for a good Conclusion of this Meeting. An Account has been laid before them of the Arrears due to the Forces of the Crown, which amount to a very great Sum. They are considering likewise of the Arrears due to the Army of *Lithuania*, and of the Demand that has been made by the Great General of that Dutchy, that the Money which he has advanced for the Subsistence of these Forces may be repaid him. It was moved some days ago in the Diet, That there being divers weighry Affairs before them which cannot possibly be dispatched in the six weeks during which the Diet is to sit according to the Constitution of this Kingdom and no longer, this Term might be prolonged, but it was rejected. As to the Affair of *Elbing*, it's left wholly to the Senate, who meet every day to consider thereof, and seem very much inclined to accommodate this Difference with the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, provided the same can be done upon reasonable Terms, and in such a manner as is consistent with the Honour of this Crown. The Bishop of *Rasb* has resigned his Office of Great Chancellor of *Poland*. General *Steynau* is made Marshal-de-Camp General of all the King's German Forces. The Marquis *de la Forest* is daily expected here from *Germany*, where he has by the King's Orders raised a Company of Gentlemen who have been all Officers, and are to attend near the King's Person as his Guards, and a sufficient Pay will be allowed, to enable them to keep a Servant and two Horses each. It continues to be said, that the King intends, as soon as the Diet is ended, to go to *Saxony*, and 'tis believed that when he returns, the Queen will come with him. Our Letters from *Lemberg* give an Account, that the Crown General had received Advice from the Bissa of *Caminitic*, that Directions were sent him from the Port forthwith to evacuate *Caminitic*, and that he was preparing every thing in order to obey the same, upon which the General had deterred his coming hither to assist at the Diet, intending first to take possession of that Place.

*Vienna*, July 28. The Count of *Oettingen* prepares with all diligence for his departure on his

Embassy to *Turkey*, having received notice that *Ibrahim Bassa*, the *Turkish* Ambassador, took his Leave on the 26th of the last Month of the *English* and *Dutch* Ambassadors at *Andrinople*, and intended to begin his Journey hither in few days. The Count of *Berlips*, Envoy from *Spain*, had Audience last *Friday* of the King and Queen of the *Romans*, whom he Complimented in the Name of the King his Master on their Marriage. Adju-tant-General *le Jay*, Envoy from the King of *Poland*, had Audience the same day of the Emperor and Empress, and on *Sunday* last returned towards *Warsaw*. The Emperor has given a great Tract of Land lying along the *Danubs* between *Buda* and *Esseck*, which lay waste during the War, to divers Persons of Quality, on condition they will take care that the same be Peopled and Manured. Our last Advices from *Hungary* say, the Imperial and *Turkish* Commissioners in that Kingdom had wholly settled the Limits of *Croatia*, having adjusted the Differences between them about the Possession of *Novi*, and some other Places on that Frontier, and were now going to regulate the Boundaries of *Transylvania*. These Advices add, that on the 20th Instant a free Market was open'd at *Esseck*, whither a great number of *Turkish* Traders came to sell their Merchandize, and that there is now a very friendly Correspondence between the *Germans* and the *Turks* on that Frontier.

*Frankfort*, August 5. A Difference happened lately between the Landgrave of *Hess-Darmstadt* and the Count of *Wylbourg*, concerning certain Arrears of Taxes due by the Inhabitants of the Bawlywick of *Huttemberg*, which these two Princes possess in Common; The Landgrave had required that part which was to be paid to him, and the Counts of *Wylbourg's* Officers coming to demand what was due to their Master, the Inhabitants refused to pay it, whereupon some Troops were sent to oblige them to a Compliance; On the other side the Landgrave sent some of his Forces to the Assistance of the Inhabitants of *Huttemberg*, who forced the Troops of *Wylbourg* to retire with some loss. The Count afterwards obtained a Mandate of the Imperial Chamber at *Wetzlar* to justify his Pretension, and demanded the Assistance of the Elector Palatine as Director of the Circle of the *Upper Rhine*; Accordingly a Regiment of Horse and another of Dragoons of his Electoral Highness's Forces being ordered to join the Count's Troop, they came to this place last Sunday on their march to *Hettavia*, and desired the Liberty of pulling over our Bridge on the *Mejn*; but the Magistrates of this City refusing not to intermeddle in this Dispute, refused it, so that the Palatine Regiments were obliged to wade through the River near this place, and two Regiments of Foot of the Elector's Forces who came hither yesterday marching the same way, and were in like manner refused passage here, went over the *Mejn* in Boats; 'Twas said, that the Landgrave of *Hess-Darmstadt* had desired the Assistance of the Landgrave of *Hess-Cassel*, and that he had ordered his Troops to march accordingly; but we have received Advice this day, that the Troops on both sides are countermanded upon the passage, there in that this Matter will be amicably composed.

*Hamburg*, August 7. On the 3d Instant some Swedish Troops came and secured a Passage over the River *Tran*, between *Lasbeck* and *Travmunde*; And on the 4th a Regiment of 1200 Swedes, commanded by Lieutenant General *Herapel*, marched from *Wismar*, and having passed the said River, continued their march by the way of *Kiel* towards *Torningen*, towards which place the Troops belonging to the Duke of *Hulstein-Gottorp* are also moving, and it's said, they are shortly to be joined by a stronger Body of Swedish Troops from *Pomerania*, and that their

Design is to rebuild the *Holmer Schans*, and two other Forts. which the Duke of *Holstein* was obliged by the King of *Denmark* about two years ago to demolish; in the meantime two *Danish* Regiments of Dragoons, and some Regiments of Foot, which are quartered in and about *Itzehoe* and *Geluckstad*, have received Orders to march towards *Rembourg*, in order, as it's believ'd, to oppose them.

*Brussels*, Aug. 11. On *Wednesday* the 5th Instant the Electors of *Bavaria* was delivered of a Prince, upon which the Elector has received the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Quality at Court; And the same evening a treble Discharge was made of the Cannon round this Place, and all other Demonstrations were given of the Publick Joy on this occasion. The young Count de la *Tour* is gone as Envoy from the Elector of *Bavaria*, to acquaint the Elector of *Cologne*, his Electoral Highness's Brother, with this joyful News, and other Envoys will be sent to notify the same to the several Courts of *Europe*. The States of *Brabant* are now assembled here, and the Elector of *Bavaria* has demanded of them a Supply of 1200000 *Livers* for the Service of the present year. The Count of *Dietrichstein*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, had Audience last Monday of his Electoral Highness. The *Sieur Galesky*, Ambassador from the King of *Poland* to the States-General, who came hither some days ago from the *Hague*, intends in a day or two to continue his Journey to *Poland*.

*Loa*, August 11. The King returned to this place on Saturday last from *Diaren*. On Sunday the Prince of *Hess-Cassel* came hither from *Holland* and dined with His Majesty, and in the evening his Highness went to *Deventer* in his way to *Cassel*. The Pensioner of *Holland*, and *Monsieur Dyckvelt* came hither likewise on Sunday from the *Hague*, and returned this morning. The Difference between the States-General, and the Elector *Palatine* and the Bishop of *Munster*, concerning the County of *Bentheim*, is accommodated; the Count de *Wich* being come hither from the Bishop to compliment His Majesty on his arrival in these Parts, and to make up that Business.

*Hague*, August 11. The Baron de *Lantier*, Resident from the Elector of *Bavaria*, has notified to the States-General, that the Electors of *Bavaria* was delivered of a Prince on the 5th Instant; and has given the same Account to all the Foreign Ministers residing here. The Deputies of the Admiralty, who have been assembled here some time to consider of divers Matters relating to our Fleet, are returned home. The Count de *Tallard*, Ambassador from *France*, is come hither from *Utrecht*.

*Paris*, August 12. N. S. The Dutchess of *Orleans's* Journey to *Lorraine* is put off, and her Servants who were sent before yesterday, are since countermanded. Great Preparations are made here for erecting the King's Statue on Horseback in the Place of *Vendosme*, which is now to change it's Name, and to be call'd the Place of *Lewis the Great*; This will be performed to morrow with great Pomp and Ceremony: The Provost and Eschevins of this City are to make a Cavalcade thither in their Formalities, the Duke de *Govres* first Gentleman of the Bed-Chamber to the King, and Governour of this City, being at their Head; And for the Diversion of the Evening, a Firework is prepared upon a wooden Building on the River, which they call the Temple of *Glory*, adorned with abundance of Figures and Devices. The Count of *Sinzendorf*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, arrived here this week from *Germany*. Our Letters from *Theulon* of the 28th of the last Month give an account, that *Monsieur Ferioles* Ambassador from this Crown to the Grand Signior, set sail from thence that day for *Constantinople*. They write from *Rochfort*, that two Men of War are fitting out, with which the *Sieur Renaud*, Engineer, is to go to *Cayenne*, and the other Southern Islands belonging to the French in *America*, to visit the Fortifications they have lately made in those Parts. We have an account from *Rochelle*, that divers Protestants having been seized there the last week as they were endeavouring to make their Escape out of the Kingdom, most of the men are sent to the Gallies, and all that they had, confiscated; and the rest have been likewise very severely Punished.

*Deale*, August 4. His Majesty's Ships the *Ludlow*, *Kent*, and *South-Sea Castle*, failed from hence yesterday to the *Westward*, as did likewise divers outward-bound Merchant Ships.
