

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of All Saints, Queensbury, comprising:—

“ All those contiguous portions of the parish of Little Stanmore (otherwise Whitchurch) of the parish of Kingsbury and of the parish of Great Stanmore all in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London which taken together are bounded upon the north-east by the new parish of Saint Alphage, Hendon, in the same County and Diocese and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Alphage, Hendon, from the said parish of Kingsbury at the junction of Edgware Road with Holmstall Avenue and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Holmstall Avenue for a distance of 21½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stag Lane and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Stag Lane for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Tewkesbury Gardens and extending thence first westward and then south-westward along the middle of Tewkesbury Gardens for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to its junction with North Way and Girton Avenue and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Girton Avenue for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Winchester Avenue and extending thence south-westward to and along the wall or fence between numbers 101 and 103 Winchester Avenue and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 3 chains or thereabouts to the middle of the Metropolitan Railway and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the railway for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the Willesden Child Welfare and Maternity Hospital and extending thence south-westward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to its south-western end upon the boundary which divides the new parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Kenton, in the same County and Diocese from the said parish of Kingsbury and extending thence north-westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following for the most part the eastern side of Honeypot Lane) for a distance of 43 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint Anselm, Belmont, in the same County and Diocese from the said parish of Great Stanmore and extending thence northward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Honeypot Lane) for a distance of 48 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Honeypot Lane with Crowshott Avenue opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the north side of Wigton Gardens and extending thence eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its eastern end and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing the Prince Edward Playing Fields) for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to the junction of St. Bride's Avenue with Camrose Avenue and extending thence north-eastward

along the middle of Camrose Avenue for a distance of 52 chains or thereabouts to its junction with High Street upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Little Stanmore from the said new parish of Saint Alphage, Hendon.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the 12th day of June, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Loxwood in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:
