Venice, July 31. Sign Venice, July 31. Signior Soranza, Ambassador from this Republick to the Grand Signior, is on his departure from hence for Constantinople. The Senate received Advice last week of the Death of Cardinal Delphins, who died at Udina in the Province of Iiuli, and is succeeded as Patriarch of Aquilea by Signior Gradino, his Coadjutor. Warsaw, July 31. The Diet which began the 16th of the last Month, being by the Constitution or the Kingdom to sit but six week, on the 24th Instant it was agreed, That the Deputies and the Senate should, during the four last days, meet together according to Custom for the better dispatch of the Business before them; Which being done, divers Matters were debated, the King himself being present but not having sinshed them on the 28th, which was to have been the last day of their sitting, they consented to continue the Meeting two days longer, and ab ut 4 this merning the Affairs they had under Consideration were bought to a good Conclusion. The Sieur Staka, Marshal of the Diet, made on this occasion a Spetch to the King, to which the Count of Denhoss, as Great-Chncellor, returned an Answer in his Majelly's Name in very obliging Terms; then the Deputies kissed the King's Hand, ant afterwards his Majesty went to St. John's Church, attended by the Senators and Deputies, where It Deam was sing. The Matters that passed the Diet, are as follows:

which are to be paid our of the Publick Revenues of this of the King on his fide has given Order rother rest of his Saxon Forces forthwith to begin their march home, and has disposed of all the vacant Employments; Prince Salpeba, Son to the Great General of Lithuania, is made of Geat Marshal of that Dutchy, and Prince Wishousky Marshal of the Court; Price Radzivil, who was Vice-Chancellor of this Kingdom, has the Place of Great Chancellor by the Sicur Skika Marshal of the late Diet. On Saturday last the Marquis d'Uxelles sent a Trumpeter to Gernersheim, another to Newstade, and a third to Keyserslauteren, to acquaint the Elector Palatine's Officers, that he has received Orders from the Court of France to put himself in Possession of these Places, unless the 200000 Livers, which the Elector Palatine is to pay to the Dutchess of Orleans pursuant to the Treaty of Ryswick, be paid before the 15th Instant; The Elector's Officers desired a longer delay, but could not obtain it, and in the mean time several French Regiments are drawing together near Landau, commanded by the Marquis d Uxelles, and under him by Monsieur de Melac, Governor of that Place.
