ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:-

Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader John Colin Mungo-PARK, D.F.C. (40008), No. 74 Squadron. (Since reported missing.)

This officer has performed excellent work in his many engagements against the enemy and has destroyed at least twelve of their aircraft. In June, 1941, he was attacked by six Messerschmitt 109's while over the French coast. He succeeded in shooting down two of these and, although his own aircraft was badly damaged, Squadron Leader Mungo-Park flew back to this country making a skilful forced landing. His courage and leadership have contributed materially to the successes achieved by his squadron.

Pilot Officer William VALE, D.F.C. (44068), No. 80 Squadron.

After the evacuation operations from Greece, this officer remained at Maleme aerodrome with some members of his unit. In the course of enemy air attacks on Crete, Pilot Officer Vale proved himself to be a staunch pilot. Frequently against odds, he continued his attacks against the enemy and destroyed four of their aircraft during an displayed great courage and determination.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Squadron Leader James RANKIN (37210), No. 92 Squadron.

Since March, 1941, this officer has led his squadron in operations over the Straits and Northern France in the course of which he has destroyed at least nine enemy aircraft and also damaged one of their trawlers. He has displayed excellent qualities of leadership and a high standard of courage which is reflected in the fact that recently, within the space of twelve days, he has destroyed six enemy fighters. Two of these were shot down in flames within one minute. He has been an inspiration to his fellow pilots.

uadron Leader James Robin WILSON (37143), No. 208 Squadron. Squadron

This officer has commanded the squadron since December, 1940. During the advance in Libya, his unit provided full and most efficient co-operation with the army under extremely difficult conditions. Ъy his spendid example and leadership, Squadron Leader Wilson contributed materially to the successes achieved in Libya, Greece and, latterly, in Syria.

Acting Squadron Leader Patrick Hamilton ALINGTON (37843), Reserve of Air Force Officers, No. 230 Squadron. This officer has acted as captain of a

Sunderland aircraft since the outbreak of the war. In December, 1940, he assumed command of the squadron and, by his outstand-ing ability and leadership, has set and maintained a high standard of efficiency.
