The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following award in recognition of gallant conduct:—

Military Cross.

Flying Officer Arthur George CORK (43119).

In April, 1941, this officer was second in command of the squadron's outparty which embarked at Alexandria for Greece. During the voyage he was in charge of 4 Lewis gun positions manned by personnel of the squadron. On the outward journey the convoy, and his ship in particular, were attacked 3 times from the air before reaching Suda Bay and once again while in the bay. When returning to Alexandria, in convoy, a further 4 attacks were made. Throughout all these attacks, which were made either by dive bombing or torpedoes, Flying Officer Cork controlled and used his guns continuously, manning individual gun positions in turn himself, although in an exposed position on the upper deck. His splendid leadership inspired the gun crew to resist the enemy with vigour and accuracy.

The KING has also been graciously pleased to give orders for the publication of the name of the undermentioned airman in the London Gazette as having received an expression of Commendation for brave conduct in connection with Civil Defence:—

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made Orders under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming the Orders made on the 12th June, 1941, in relation to the Schemes prepared by the East Norfolk Rivers (including the River Waveney) Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Act, making provision for the following matters:—

(1) The constitution of the Lower Yare First Internal Drainage District and of a Drainage Board therefor.

(2) The constitution of the Lower Yare Second Internal Drainage District and of a Drainage Board therefor, the abrogation of the powers of the Chet Valley Commissioners of Sewers so far as such powers are exercisable within the said Internal Drainage District, and the abolition of the Claxton and Rockland Drainage Board.
