Madrid, August 5. N.S.

THE King of Spain is recovered of his last Illness, and has been abroad every day this week to take the Air. This morning died the *Almirante of Arragon*, who was appointed to succeed the *Marquis of Astorgas* in the Office of *Captain-General* of the Forces in this Kingdom. The *Count of Monasterol*, Envoy from the *Electors of Bavaria*, has had his Audience of Leave of their Catholic Majesties, and is on his departure for *Flanders*. The *Duke of Turfis* is come hither to take Possession of the Dignity of *Grandee of Spain*, lately conferr'd on him by the King; The Gallies under his Command continue at *Barcelona*; where 8 *French Gallies* arrived the last Month, and after having stayed 2 or 3 days in that Port, proceeded towards the Island of *Majorca*. Our Letters from *Cadiz* of the 20th of the last Month give an Account, of the Arrival in that Port of two *French Men of War* commanded by *Monfieur Relingue*. An Express is arrived here from *Ceuta* with an Account, that the *Spaniards* having received considerable Supplies of Soldiers and Ammunition from the Coasts of *Andalusia* and *Catalonia*; they resolved to attack the *Moors*, and accordingly after having set fire to several Mines with very good effect, they made a great Sally, and beat the Enemy from their Trenches; In which Action above 4000 of the *Moors* were killed, and the Loss on the side of the *Spaniards* was inconsiderable. Our Letters from *Lisbon* give an Account, that the *Queen of Portugal* is dangerously ill of an *Erysipela* in her Breast.

Milan, August 5. The *Prince of Vaudemont* is going in a day or two to *Cosmo*, to meet the *Duke of Savoy* as he passes through that Place in his return from *St. Maurice*. The General Review of the Forces of this State which was appointed for the 8th of this Month, is put off till the beginning of *September*.

Warsaw, Aug. 10. An Extraordinary Assembly of the Senate will be held here on Wednesday next to consider of several Matters, and particularly of the Affair of *Eibing*, which it's hoped will new be brought to a friendly Accommodation, Commissioners from the *Electors of Brandenburg* being expected here, who are to Treat with those the *King of Poland* will appoint for that purpose. The *Crown-General* is come hither from *Rusland*, having adjusted with the *Turkish* Commissioners all Matters relating to the Evacuation of *Caminice*, of which we do not doubt but the Forces of *Poland* are in Possession before this time. Divers of the Inhabitants of *Rusland* and the neighbouring Provinces are preparing to

go and settle at *Caminice* and in *Podolia*, and for their better Encouragement, an Exemption from Taxes and other Privileges will be granted them for several years. The King has sent his Servants before to the Baths at *Teplitz*, and intends to begin his Journey thither on Monday next, leaving the chief Administration of Publick Affairs during his Absence with the *Cardinal Primate*, whom he has also nominated to be one of the Deputies that are to confer with the Commissioners of *Brandenburgh* about adjusting the Business of *Elbing*.

Vienna, August 12. The Emperor has given to the *Count de Harrach* the Chief Direction of the Affairs of *Hungary*, and intends to appoint a Council for the better Government of that Kingdom. The *Baron of Tharunath*, and several other Commissioners, are nominated to go and visit the Fortifications that are making in *Hungary* and *Transylvania*, as also to view the Mines of Silver which the Emperor has in those Parts. The Differences between this Court and the *Ottoman* Port, touching the Limits between the two Empires, are not yet adjusted, each Party insisting upon the Possession of *Novi* on the Borders of *Croatia*, which Place will be of considerable Advantage to those that are Masters of it, in covering their Frontiers on that side. The Emperor's Ministers are employed in making divers Regulations concerning the Army, and among other things, have resolved for the future to give the Officers 30 Florins a Month, instead of the Ammunition-Bread which they used to receive. The *Duke of Saxi-Zeitz*, *Bishop of Raab*, is made one of the Emperor's Council, and intends to go in few days to *Rome*, in order, as is said, to be made a *Cardinal* at the next Promotion. The *Count of Berlips*, Envoy Extraordinary from the *King of Spain*, has had Audience of the *Queen of the Romans*, to whom he delivered a very considerable Present of Jewels from the *Queen of Spain*. The *Count Palatine Gustavus Leopold of Deux-Ponts*, who was a Colonel in the Emperor's Service, has quitted his Command, and has taken *Priests Orders*.

Francfort, August 19. We have received an Account from *Landau* of the 16th Instant, that the Receivers of the *Electors Palatine's* Rents have paid to the *Marquis d'Uxelles*, for the use of the *Dutchess of Orleans*, 200000 *Livers* in ready Money and Bills of Exchange, and that a delay of two Months is allowed them for paying 100000 *Livers* more, pursuant to what has been agreed between his *Electoral Highness* and the *Dutchess of Orleans*, and several of these Officers are to remain with the *Marquis d'Uxelles* at *Landau* as Hostages, till the whole Sum be paid.

We have received an Account of the Elector Palatine's arrival at *Weynheim*, where he intends to continue some time; His Electoral Highness in his Journey thither visited the new Fortifications at *Nankheim*, which he found in good forwardness. They write from *Bamberg*, that the Elector of *Rhine* went some days ago to *Heisfeld*, between that Place and *Barck*, where he had an Interview with the Margrave of *Barck*, after which he returned to *Bamberg*.

Sleswick, August 20. The Troops belonging to the King of *Sweden* and the Duke of *Holslein*, which are lately drawn together in these Parts, are making a Line from the *Eyder* to *Husum*. It's said, the Danish Troops quartered at *Giuckstad* and *Itzehoe* have Orders to hinder this Work, but we have yet no Account of their being on their March for this purpose.

Brussels, August 25. The Elector of *Bavaria* went from hence on the 19th Instant to view the Fortifications of *Mons*, and to review his Regiment of Guards which is quartered there, and he is expected back to morrow. The Electress has been very ill since her lying in, but is now pretty well recovered. The Project of making a new Canal in *Flanders* is wholly laid aside, and it's said, the States of the *Spanish Netherlands* have some Thoughts of recalling the Placets they have lately published for prohibiting the Importation of Foreign Goods. The Count of *Tirimonz* and the *Sieur Broeckhoveu*, Commissioners from *Spain* for settling the Limits in the *Netherlands*, are still here, and the Council of State is frequently assembled, to consider of the Instructions to be given them touching some Difficulties that are arisen between them and the *French Commissioners*, and as soon as they have received them, they will return to *Lisse* to renew the Conferences.

Loo, August 25. On Tuesday in the afternoon His Majesty went to *Dieren*, and returned hither on Saturday last. The Count de *Dhona*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, arrived here the last week from the *Hague*, to wait on His Majesty, and will return in a day or two to *Holland*. The Duke of *Wirtemberg*, General of the *Dutch* Infantry, came hither yesterday to receive His Majesty's further Orders touching the Review near *Aernhem*, which will begin on Tuesday next, and last four days. Mr. *Read*, Steward to my Lord *Paget*, is arrived here in three weeks from *Andrinople* with Letters to the King from the Grand Signior and the Grand Visier, acknowledging His Majesty's good Offices in Mediating the Peace lately concluded between the Christian Princes and the Port.

Hague, August 25. The Regiment of Horse-Guards were reviewed yesterday morning by the Earl of *Portland*, and are to begin their March to *Arnhem* next Thursday, and the Regiment of Foot-Guards are to follow the next day. The Count de *Prela*, Ambassador Extraordinary from the Duke of *Savoy*, is returned hither from *Loo*, and intends shortly to be going for *England*. The Heer *Dyckvelt*, who has been to wait on His Majesty at *Loo*, is likewise returned hither, and it's said, he is shortly to go again to *Brussels*.

Paris, August 26. N. S. The Court continues at *Marli*. The Princess of *Dombes*, Daughter to the Duke of *Maine*, is lately dead; as is also Monsieur *Gondreville*, Governor of *Schelfet*, in *Alsace*. Our Letters from *Havre de Grace* of the

22d Instant say, Monsieur *Farban*, Chief Engineer to the King, was come to that Place to give Directions for several Works to be made for the Improvement of that Port.

Portsmouth, August 17. His Majesty's Ships the *Arandel* and *Carlise* are sailed from *St. Helens* to the Westward.

Desic, August 17. Divers outward-bound Merchant Ships, to the number of about 40, sailed from hence yesterday to the Westward, the Wind being at N. N. E.
